## SCAC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Games of March 17 – March 23

**ANDY WHITE OF AUSTIN COLLEGE**, a 6-1, 180-pound sophomore shortstop from Dallas, Texas, has been named the SCAC Offensive Baseball Player-of-the-Week for games played Monday, March 17 through Sunday, March 23.

**White** came up big at the plate as the 'Roos swept Hendrix in four games, batting .429 with a home run, a triple, a double and nine runs batted in. **White** had a .857 slugging percentage and 12 total bases, and also scored eight times during the week. For the season, **White** is hitting .386 (ninth in the SCAC) and slugging .602 (10th in the SCAC). He has scored 22 runs (tied for seventh in the SCAC) and has driven in 16 with nine doubles (tied for seventh in the SCAC), two triples (tied for eighth in the SCAC) and two home runs.

### Other outstanding individual performances in the SCAC:

**Sophomore first baseman Evan Jones of Trinity** led the Tigers to a 6-1 record last week, including a 3-1 SCAC series win over Southwestern. Jones hit .500 (14-28) during the seven games, scoring eight runs and collecting 14 RBI. He cracked six doubles and a home run, totaling 23 bases for a slugging percentage of .821 for the week. Against Southwestern, Jones drove in six runs to lead the Tigers to their second SCAC series win of the year, and a tie for first place in the SCAC West Division. **Sophomore outfielder Chris Lucas of Oglethorpe** paced the Petrel offense this week as they took 3 out of 4 from Sewanee. Lucas was hot all week hitting .500 (11 for 22) while knocking in 10 runs and scoring four times. He had two doubles, a home run and a stolen base. In Friday's 20-2 victory, Lucas was 3-for-4 with five RBI including his home run. On Saturday, he went 4-for-8 in the doubleheader split with three RBI - including the game-winner in the bottom of the eighth of Saturday's 6-5 win. He ended the series with a 1-for-4 performance with a run scored and a RBI on Sunday. **Junior outfielder Hunter Owen of Millsaps** went 4-for-5 with six RBIs and five runs scored in a 21-16 win over No. 21 Illinois Wesleyan, the Majors' only competition of the week. The junior from Jackson launched a pair of home runs to give him seven on the early season and also recorded a double en route to 11 total bases in the win and a 2.200 slugging percentage. **Sophomore infielder Taylor Hoffman of DePauw** went 4-for-8 in the first three games with Birmingham-Southern including a double with three runs and one RBI. He walked three times for a .636 on-base percentage and finished the week with a .750 slugging percentage. Hoffman went 4-for-6 in the final two games of weekend. **Junior outfielder Jeffrey Williams of Centre** hit .533 (8-15) and scored six runs from the lead-off position in helping Centre split four games last week. Williams had three multiple hit games and scored at least one run in all four games. The junior outfielder was 2-for-3 with two runs scored in a loss Birmingham Southern Monday and then went 2-for-4 with a run scored in a loss to Piedmont. In the Colonels sweep over Maryville, Williams was 4-for-8 on the day with three runs scored and two more driven in. He also stole two bases in two attempts, walked once, was hit by a pitch once and was flawless in the field with a 1.000 fielding percentage in 10 chances. **Junior first baseman Taylor Burns of Sewanee** had six runs, four RBIs, three homeruns, and a double in Sewanee's doubleheader last Saturday against Oglethorpe. The Tigers split the day with the Petrels and went 1-3 on the weekend. **Sophomore third baseman Eric Mathis of Hendrix** went 6-for-13 with two runs, one triple, two homers and five RBI in Hendrix's second conference series of the year. He tallied a .462 batting average, 1.077 slugging percentage and .533 on-base percentage. **Birmingham-Southern, Rhodes** and **Southwestern** did not nominate anyone for the award.

## SCAC PITCHER OF THE WEEK

Games of March 17 – March 23

**SAM BRIEND OF OGLETHORPE UNIVERSITY**, a 6-3, 195-pound sophomore right-hander from Cumming, Ga., has been selected the SCAC Baseball Pitcher-of-the-Week for games played from Monday, March 17 through Sunday, March 23.

**Briend** went 2-0 this week with both wins coming against Sewanee. The first win came in the third game of the series where he went 3.0 innings of relief, giving up just one hit and one run. Briend slammed the door shut in the ninth by striking out the side to secure Saturday's 6-5 win. He then came back to start the fourth game of the series the following day and went a gutsy 5.1 innings and struck out four while allowing two runs on six hits as the Petrels prevailed 12-2. For the week, **Briend** finished up 2-0 with eight strikeouts in 8.0 innings pitched and is now 4-0 with a 3.06 ERA on the season. He has struck out 24 batters in his 32 innings of work.

### Other outstanding individual performances in the SCAC:

**Junior left-hander Evan Bronson of Trinity** tossed a four-hit shutout in his only appearance for the Tigers last week, striking out seven in the seven-inning game that evened the SCAC series at one game each. Bronson gave up just one hit and struck out five batters over the final four innings of the game, earning his team-leading fourth win of the season. **Junior right-hander Cory Stevens of Austin College** had perhaps the finest outing of his career in an 8-0 victory over Hendrix over the weekend, throwing a complete game shutout in which he struck out a career-high 12 batters against just three walks. Stevens scattered seven hits over seven innings to pick up his fourth win of the season. **Senior left-hander Jeremy Alland of DePauw** started the series with Birmingham-Southern by pitching seven shutout innings and allowing six hits with four strikeouts and one walk in Saturday's 8-0 victory over the Panthers. **Sophomore right-hander Greg Bartleski of Sewanee** pitched seven innings and a complete game in Sewanee's win over Oglethorpe Saturday. The sophomore from Charlottesville, Va. committed one error, walked one batter, and struck out four in Sewanee's 13-3 win. **Senior pitcher John Herbert of Centre** continued to perform well for the Colonels tossing a four-hit complete-game shutout against the defending Great South Conference champion Maryville (Tenn.). It was Herbert's second win of the season against the Scots, which entered the game winning six of their previous eight games. He allowed only four hits through seven innings with four strikeouts and no walks, facing just three batters over the minimum. After two Scots reach base in the first inning, Herbert allowed only two more Scots to reach base the remainder of the game. He retired seven in a row from the first to third inning and then six more in a row from the fourth through the sixth. He allowed only one Maryville hitter to reach third base the entire game in completing his third straight start of the season. **Birmingham-Southern, Hendrix, Millsaps, Rhodes** and **Southwestern** did not nominate anyone for the award.

**AROUND THE SCAC**

**Austin College** vaulted into a tie for first place in the SCAC West with a four game sweep of Hendrix, getting two shutouts in the process. The 'Roos took game one 11-5 before sweeping Friday's doubleheader by scores of 8-0 and 7-3, and then closed out the weekend with an 11-0 victory on Saturday. Cory Stevens hurled perhaps the best game of his career in the 8-0 victory, striking out 12 batters in seven complete shutout innings. Tyler Steed also pitched a complete game shutout, scattering six hits over eight innings in the 11-0 victory on Saturday. Andy White and Bobby Schleizer had big weekends at the plate, with Schleizer batting .583 with a double, a home run, and four runs batted in, while White hit .429 with a homer, a triple, a double and nine RBI.

**Birmingham-Southern** went 1-3 this week to drop to 10-11 on the season. BSC defeated Centre College 13-3 to close out a four-game series on Monday. BSC broke open a 2-1 game with a six-run third inning on its way to an 13-3 win in seven innings. The Panthers were swept by DePauw University on Saturday by the scores of 8-0 and 11-3. DePauw held a 1-0 lead until sixth in game one before seven unearned runs crossed the plate in game one. BSC held a 3-2 lead into the sixth before DePauw scored nine unanswered runs to take the 11-3 victory in game two. BSC tried to rally from a 7-3 deficit on Sunday before a pop out left the bases loaded in the ninth. The Panthers conclude the series with DePauw on Monday at 2 p.m. before traveling to Transylvania University for a three-game series, starting with a doubleheader on Saturday at 3 p.m.

**Centre** split four games this week to go 2-2. The Colonels dropped the fourth game of the series to Birmingham Southern 13-3 Monday night to go 1-3 against the Panthers. Centre's game against Emory scheduled from Wednesday was cancelled due to rain. The Colonels then fell 11-4 to Piedmont Thursday, before sweeping a doubleheader against Maryville (3-0, 12-4) Saturday. The sweep against Maryville gives Centre three wins and a season sweep over the Scots after dropping all four contests last year. The Colonels, now 9-6 overall and 1-3 in the SCAC will play a non-conference game against Thomas More Tuesday before hosting DePauw in a four-game SCAC series Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

**DePauw** opened its four-game series with Birmingham-Southern with three straight wins as they swept a doubleheader by 8-0 and 11-3 scores and then took a 7-3 victory in Sunday's single game. The wins lifted DePauw's record to 14-3 overall and 3-0 in the SCAC and extended their win streak to six straight. The 14-3 start is DePauw's best since it opened the 1996 campaign with a 17-3 record.

**Hendrix** was swept in their four-game series against Austin College over the weekend. The Kangaroos won Thursday night's affair 11-5, Friday's doubleheader 8-0 and 7-3 and Saturday's game 11-0. The Warriors fall to 11-19 overall and 1-7 in SCAC play. Hendrix will look to snap its five-game losing streak when the team faces the University of the Ozarks on March 25. Sophomore third baseman Eric Mathis led the Warriors over the weekend with a .462 batting average (6-for-13), two runs, one triple, two home runs and five runs batted in. Junior centerfielder Daniel Ward collected three doubles, a triple and an RBI against the Kangaroos. Hendrix was outscored 37-8 in the series and out-hit 40-28.

**Millsaps** won its only game of the week, 21-16, over No. 21 Illinois Wesleyan, using a 10-run fifth inning to blow the game wide open and six home runs from Hunter Owen (2), Russ Boyd, Hunter Abrams, Ronnie Wheat and Derrik Boland. In a "hitters ballpark" with nearly 25 mph winds blowing straight out to center, Millsaps (16-7, 2-2 SCAC) plated two runs in both the first and third innings to take an early 4-1 lead, scoring 10 in the decisive fifth frame after the Titans retook the lead at 5-4 to eventually hold on for the 5-run win after IWU scored 11 runs over the final four innings. Senior southpaw Travis Bogue (5-2) was credited with the win for Millsaps after tossing 3.0 innings in relief of starter John David Childs, while Alex Tosi was hit with the loss for IWU in 4.2 innings of work to fall to 0-1 on the year. The Majors, winners of 10 of their last 12, will continue a 12-game homestand on Tuesday, March 25 at 6 p.m., hosting NAIA-foe Belhaven College in the Cowboy Maloney Trophy Series. The Blazers are 3-0 in the series, while Millsaps is 2-1 and MS College is 0-4.

**Oglethorpe** went 3-3 this past week, taking 3 of 4 in a weekend series with SCAC rival Sewanee in the process. The Petrels started the week losing both ends of a doubleheader at Huntingdon on Tuesday, 7-6 and 12-0. Numerous Petrels had good days at the plate in Game 1, including Andrew Llano, who went 3-for-4 with 2 RBI and Jason Mitchell, who went 2-for-3 with a run scored. In the four-game series with Sewanee, Oglethorpe's bats broke out in a serious way. They won the first game 20-2 and scored 18 runs in the first three innings.

**AROUND THE SCAC**

Chris Lucas led the way for **Oglethorpe**, going 3-for-4 with a home run, a double and five RBI. Matt Anderson also had a big night, going 3-for-3 with two doubles, a sac fly, four RBI and two runs scored. Sean Tuttle threw a complete game in the effort, giving up seven hits and one earned run while striking out six. In the second game of the series, the Petrels had an ugly defensive game, committing six errors en route to a 13-3 defeat at the hands of the Tigers. Lucas had another good game for the Petrels, though, going 2-for-4 at the plate. But the Petrels came back and won later that day in the third game of the series, getting another standout performance from Lucas, who went 2-for-4 with three RBI, including the game-winning sac fly in the eighth inning. OU also got three quality innings of relief work from Sam Briend, who picked up the win, giving up a hit and a run and striking out the side in the ninth inning. Then finally in the fourth game of the series on Sunday, the Petrels won 12-2 behind another great performance from Briend, who picked up his second win in less than 24 hours with 5 1/3 innings of six-hit baseball, allowing just two runs and striking out four. Oglethorpe will be back in action this week with a 7 p.m. game at non-conference rival Piedmont on Wednesday, and then a 7 p.m. home game against DePauw on Thursday.

**Rhodes** was 1-1 on the week, splitting the weekend series with #5 Emory University. The Lynx were rained out earlier in the week against #13 Illinois Wesleyan, before taking to the road against Emory on Friday and Saturday. The Lynx took game one 8-4, behind yet another strong pitching performance by Junior Andy Holt. Holt is now 5-2 on the year with a 1.68 ERA. Rhodes lost the second game 10-1. Senior Robert Flanagan took the loss for the Lynx. He is now 3-2 on the year with a 3.32 ERA. The offense was paced by Rhodes' all-time career hits leader Richard Hurd. Hurd went 4-8 on the week with a double and a run scored. The Lynx will be at home against Mississippi College on Tuesday and Christian Brothers University on Wednesday before heading to Sewanee for their second weekend of conference play.

**Sewanee** Head Coach Scott Baker picked up his 100th career win the week, becoming only the second coach in Tiger history to achieve this milestone. Legendary coach Shirley majors is the all-time leader with 102 wins. The Tigers were 1-3 at Oglethorpe on the weekend to open up 2008 SCAC play. Sewanee is now 3-14 so far and will host Rhodes this weekend.

**Southwestern** posted a 2-3 record this past week as the Pirates closed out non-conference play and began their SCAC schedule. On Monday, SU played Concordia-Austin at The Dell Diamond, home of the Houston Astros Triple-A affiliate Round Rock Express, and fell 11-0. Then, on Wednesday, Southwestern hosted Cardinal Stritch University and defeated the NAIA school handily, 12-4. The next day, SU traveled to San Antonio for a four-game set with Trinity. The Pirates won the first game 6-5 and starter Wes Willis improved his record on the year to 5-1 while raising his SCAC-leading strikeout total to 53. The doubleheader on Friday started with a seven inning duel that ended 2-0. The Pirates managed just four hits and Trinity was able to string together three two-out hits in the fifth for their two runs. The second game of the double-dip saw the Pirates take a 7-3 lead in to the bottom of the seventh but the Tigers totaled seven runs in that inning and the eighth for the 10-7 win. The final game was all offense as TU came out on top 15-11 with both teams combining for 33 hits, the most in a SCAC game this season. This week, Southwestern travels to Jackson, MS for four game with Millsaps.

**Trinity** went 6-1 over the past week, playing every day from Monday through Saturday. Trinity was 3-0 to start the week, beating three straight NAIA teams before welcoming Southwestern for a four-game SCAC weekend series. After losing the opening game of the series, Trinity then swept a Friday doubleheader and won the finale to secure its second SCAC series in as many chances. Saturday's win not only clinched the series win, but also gave Head Coach Tim Scannell his 300th career victory. Scannell, in his 10th season at the helm of the Tiger baseball program, is just the second coach in school history to reach the milestone. Six different pitchers earned wins over the past week, including three first-year players for the Tigers. Highlighting the Tiger pitching staff's week was Evan Bronson's four-hit shutout in game one of Friday's doubleheader. Trinity had 27 doubles and six home runs during the seven-game stretch of home games last week, posting an overall batting average of .368 (27-62). Three players hit .500 or better last week, including leading hitter Evan Jones, who went 14-28 in his seven games played. Also hitting .500 for the week were Jeff Claydon (8-16) and Jordan Pennington (8-16).
