SCAC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Games of March 24 – March 30

KYLE FELIX OF TRINITY UNIVERSITY, a 6-3, 205-pound first-year designated hitter from Woodside, Calif., has been named the SCAC Offensive Baseball Player-of-the-Week for games played Monday, March 24 through Sunday, March 30.

Felix led the Tigers in hitting last week, sparking the team to a 5-0 record that included a four-game weekend sweep at Austin College. **Felix** hit .556 (10-18) for the week, cracking a double, a triple, and two home runs in the five games. He scored six runs and led the team with 11 RBI and 19 total bases. He had eight RBI in Saturday's doubleheader at Austin College. **Felix** finished the week with a slugging percentage of 1.056 and an on-base percentage of .571. For the season, **Felix** is hitting .330 (30-91) with 19 runs and 29 RBI. He has totaled five doubles and two triples, as well as five home runs.

Other outstanding individual performances in the SCAC:

First-year utility player Brent Lindsey of Rhodes continues to pace the Lynx as he went 6 for 14 on the week (.428) and also walked eight times and was hit by a pitch to post a .652 on-base percentage. For the week, Lindsey had 11 RBI raising his season total to 34 (third in the SCAC). He also added nine runs scored with a double, triple and his second home run of the season. Junior centerfielder Justin Weiner of DePauw hit safely in the Tigers' final seven games of the week and finished the week with 13 hits in 30 at bats (.433). He stole 11 bases in as many attempts and scored at least two runs in five of the eight games - finishing the week with 15 runs scored. He also had two doubles and a home run among his 13 hits and drove in seven. Weiner also played errorless ball in centerfield in all eight games - handling all 18 of his chances. Junior catcher Michael Murphy of Southwestern helped power the Pirates to a series win over #23 Millsaps as SU took three of four from the Majors. Murphy went 7-for-15 on the weekend and raised his batting average from .300 to .324 on the season. Five of his seven hits were for extra bases as he totaled four doubles and one home run off of Major pitching. The catcher drove in six runs and scored three times for the Pirates. On the weekend, he had a .500 on-base percentage and he now has a five-game hitting streak going. Murphy also struck out just once during the series. Junior first baseman Matt Giza of Hendrix was 4-for-4 with a double, a triple, a walk, a sacrifice fly, three runs and three RBI in the Warriors 17-10 victory over No. 19 University of the Ozarks on March 25. Junior outfielder Hunter Owen of Millsaps batted .462 (6-for-13) on the week for Millsaps with five RBIs and three home runs to extend his season-long hitting streak out to nine games and push his season average back to .402. The junior also drew seven walks and scored six runs, while staying perfect on the season with four more stolen bases to improve to 18-for-18 on the year. Owen is just one homer shy of tying the 11 he hit last year and four shy of tying the Millsaps single-season record of 14 set by Garner Wetzel in 2006. First-year third baseman Taylor Irwin of Sewanee went 7-for-17 on the week (.412) batting in six RBIs and hitting one home run. The Tigers are 4-17 and 2-4 in the SCAC East after going 1-2 against Rhodes last weekend. Austin College, Birmingham-Southern, Centre and Oglethorpe did not nominate anyone for the award.

SCAC PITCHER OF THE WEEK

Games of March 24 – March 30

BRIAN OATES OF TRINITY UNIVERSITY, a 6-3, 205-pound senior right-hander from Huntsville, Texas, has been selected the SCAC Baseball Pitcher-of-the-Week for games played from Monday, March 24 through Sunday, March 30.

Oates led the Tigers to a 5-0 record last week, earning two of the victories himself and recording a team-best 16 total strikeouts. He was 2-0 with an ERA of 1.80 last week, giving up just two earned runs in 10 innings of work. The highlight of his week was in the series opener at Austin College, in which **Oates** struck out a career-high 15 batters to lead the team to a 6-2 win on Friday. The 15 strikeouts were the fourth-highest single game strikeout total in school history. He also earned the win against McMurry earlier in the week, pitching a scoreless eighth inning in relief. For the season, **Oates** is 4-1 with an ERA of 3.52 in eight appearances. The complete game this weekend was his first of the year – third of his career – and he has yielded just 18 earned runs in 46 innings. **Oates** is now fifth in Trinity history and ninth in SCAC history with 234 career strikeouts.

Other outstanding individual performances in the SCAC:

Junior right-hander Wes Willis of Southwestern won his sixth game of the season on Friday (Mar. 28) and his third-straight decision. The junior righty threw seven innings for a complete game win as the Pirates run-ruled the Majors 14-2. Willis allowed just two earned run on six hits while striking out 10 and walking only one. He is now 6-1 on the season and has struck out 63 batters while walking just eight, good for a 7.88 K/BB ratio. Senior right-hander John Tschantz of DePauw pitched a three-hit complete game in Saturday's 3-0 win against Centre. He finished the week with an ERA of 1.00 - allowing just one run in nine innings while striking out five and walking two. First-year right-hander Taylor Babich of Rhodes picked up his first and second career wins this past week. On Tuesday he pitched the final 3.0 innings against Mississippi College to earn the victory as the Lynx scored three in the bottom of the ninth to pull out the 6-5 victory. Babich did not allow a runner to reach base while striking out four. He followed this performance with his first college career start against Sewanee. Babich picked up the win as he went 7.0 innings, allowing six hits and two earned runs without walking a batter and striking out four. On the week he went 10.0 innings surrendering six hits, no walks and two earned runs while striking out eight. First-year right-handed pitcher Aaron Williams of Millsaps, in his only appearance on the week, threw a complete-game, 4-hitter to knock off Southwestern in Game 2 of a 4-game series, 7-1, surrendering just one run while striking out three and holding opponents to a .160 average. Sophomore right-hander Greg Bartleski of Sewanee pitched his third complete game of the season and his third straight win against Rhodes on Sunday. He allowed three hits, three runs, and struck out seven. Austin College, Birmingham-Southern, Centre, Hendrix and Oglethorpe did not nominate anyone for the award.

AROUND THE SCAC

Austin College had a rough weekend series against SCAC West leading Trinity, as the Tigers came to Sherman and swept the 'Roos in their four game series. Trinity's bats proved to be too much for the 'Roos, getting to AC's pitchers early in games two, three, and four. Cory Stevens put together his second straight solid performance on the mound, striking out nine batters in Friday's 6-2 loss. Patrick Ray was one of the bright spots at the plate for Austin College, hitting .444 with a double, an RBI and two runs scored. Ray also threw out three runners on steal attempts from his catcher position. John Reisig finished the series 4-for-12, while Lee Cohen and Bennett Herrick each homered for the 'Roos. As a team, the 'Roos managed to hit just .239 for the weekend, and ultimately were unable to generate enough offense to come back from the early deficits in three of the four games.

Birmingham-Southern did not report.

Centre went 1-4 on the week falling to Thomas More 10-3 on the road and then winning one of four from DePauw on the weekend. The Colonels opened the conference series with a 13-5 win as senior pitcher John Herbert completed his fourth game of the season - third nine-inning game - to improve to 4-0. Centre then fell 3-0 in a pitcher's duel in game one Saturday before losing 13-3 in game two of the day. DePauw then took game four 20-5 in the series finale. Centre, now 10-10 overall and 2-6 in the SCAC, will play Transylvania in a non-conference game this week prior to a weekend home series with Oglethorpe.

DePauw opened the week by defeating Birmingham-Southern and wrapping up a four-game sweep of the Panthers and then defeated fifth-ranked Piedmont to extend their win streak to a season-long eight games. After losing to Emory and defeating Oglethorpe in a non-conference game, the Tigers wrapped up the week by taking three of four at Centre. For the week, Justin Weiner hit .433 and scored 15 runs in the eight games. He also stole 11 bases in as many attempts. Adam Ford batted .429 for the week with a team-best 10 RBI and seven doubles and a .679 slugging percentage. John Tschantz allowed just one run and five hits in nine innings of two appearances with a 1.00 ERA and opponents hit .156 against him. Aaron Meyers posted a 1.17 ERA for the week in two appearances. Paul Rodenhouse notched three saves in his three relief appearances. The Tigers' 20-5 record is their best at this stage of the season since 1996.

Hendrix defeated No. 19 University of the Ozarks on Tuesday, March 25 in a 17-10 slugfest. The Warriors improved to 12-19 overall. The win snaps a five game losing streak for the Warriors and marks their first victory over Ozarks in three years. First-year first baseman Matt Giza was 4-for-4 with three runs and three RBI, while first year DH Jeff Forgerson went 5-for-6 with four RBI. The Warriors raced to an early 6-0 lead by scoring two runs in the opening frame and four more in the second off a combined eight hits. The Eagles scored their first run of the contest in the third, before Hendrix added another pair of runs in the bottom half. The Warriors increased their advantage to 11-1 in the fourth when sophomore third baseman Eric Mathis led off with a walk and Giza smashed a triple to bring home the first score of the inning. Junior catcher David Foley and Forgerson hit back-to-back singles to bring Giza home. Foley eventually crossed the plate on an error. Hendrix managed one run in the fifth and seventh, while Ozarks made it a three-run tilt by putting two across in the fifth, three in the sixth and four in the eighth. The Warriors answered in the bottom half of the eighth by scoring four runs and sealing the deal. Hendrix junior right-hander Aaron Gankofskie started on the hill and earned his first win of the season. The Warriors matched a season best 19 hits and 14 RBI. Five Hendrix batters posted multiple hit performances, including junior centerfielder Daniel Ward (2-for-3, 3 R, 2 RBI), sophomore leftfielder Nathan Hill (3-for-6, 2 R, 1 RBI), Giza (4-for-4, 3 R, 3 RBI), Foley (2-for-5, 2 R, 2 RBI) and Forgerson (5-for-6, 4 RBI).

Millsaps stumbled to a 1-4 record on the week with losses to NAIA-foe Belhaven College, 16-10, and a 3-1 series loss to SCAC-foe Southwestern – the first SCAC series loss at home since 2005. Belhaven had nine different players record a hit off seven different Millsaps pitchers as the staff surrendered a season-high 22 hits and the most since March 25, 2004, when Huntingdon cranked out 18 hits. Millsaps jumped out to an early 2-0 lead through the first two innings on a pair of sac flies from Hunter Abrams and Jeremy Aliff before Belhaven came storming back with 12 unanswered runs over the subsequent five innings to take an insurmountable 12-2 lead that the Majors could not overcome. In the series against SU, Millsaps was lit up in the opening game of the series, 14-2 (7), when the Pirates scored 11 runs over the first four innings. Prior to Friday, Millsaps' worst home loss came back on Feb. 27, 2000, to the same Southwestern squad, falling 15-3 and 16-3 in back-to-back days as they finished the 2000 slate with a 19-20-1 overall record – the last time a Jim Page team finished below .500. Freshman Aaron Williams (3-0, 3.67 ERA) got the Majors back to 1-1 in the series with a 4-hit shutout in the opening game on Saturday before the Pirates won Games 3 (9-6) and Games 4 (3-2) to win the series. Junior Hunter Owen batted .462 (6-for-13) on the week for Millsaps with five RBIs and three home runs to extend his season-long hitting streak out to nine games and push his season average back to .402. The junior also drew seven walks and scored six runs, while staying perfect on the season with four more stolen bases to improve to 18-for-18 on the year. Owen is just one homer shy of tying the 11 he hit last year and four shy of tying the Millsaps single-season record of 14 set by Garner Wetzel in 2006. Freshman Josh Ordeneaux also pushed his hitting streak out to 18 games in 18 career games played with a single in the ninth inning of Sunday's finale. The Majors will welcome MS College to town on Tuesday night before an important 4-game series at home with Hendrix College April 4-6.

AROUND THE SCAC

Oglethorpe continued its upward turn this past week, splitting two contests with nationally ranked Piedmont College and DePauw University. On Wednesday, Oglethorpe earned a huge 9-8 victory over #7 Piedmont College in Demorest, Georgia. The Petrels offense got in high gear as they pounded out 17 hits against the Lions and senior right-hander Nick Greenfield turned in 8 solid innings of work to earn the win. Six Petrels recorded multiple hits in the upset over Piedmont: Brendan Pilger, Andrew Llano, Ben Giddens, Andy Farrey, Andrew Lofholm and Matt Anderson. The next night against #27 DePauw University, the Petrels led for most of the contest before falling, 13-10. Again, the Petrels were able to bang out a solid 13 hits but the Tigers posted 7 runs in the final three innings to secure the victory on Anderson Field in Atlanta. The Petrels are back in action Tuesday against cross-town rival and national powerhouse Emory University before a weekend series against Centre College in Danville, Kentucky.

Rhodes was 4-1 on the week with wins over visiting Mississippi College and Christian Brothers before taking 2 of 3 games on the road against Sewanee. The Lynx started the week with an exciting 6-5 come from behind victory over Mississippi College. Rhodes needed a three-run bottom of the ninth to claim victory. On Wednesday cross town rival Division II Christian Brothers visited Stauffer Field as the Lynx pounded out 12 hits, six for extra bases, and drew 15 walks en route to a 16-6 victory. Rhodes then took to the road against Sewanee taking 2 of 3 games. One game of the conference series was lost due to rain and fog. Rhodes took the first game of the series 7-6 behind a strong pitching performance by freshman Taylor Babich, then lost the second game of the series 4-3, before taking game three 15-1. Senior Chris Catalanotto picked up his fourth victory of the year. The Lynx pitching staff was led by Babich who was 2-0 on the week working 10 innings, striking out eight, did not walk a batter and gave up six hits for an opposing batting average of .171. The Lynx offense was led by senior Richard Hurd and freshman Brent Lindsey. Lindsey was 6-for-14 on the week with a double, triple, homerun, scored nine runs, 11 RBIs, and walked eight times. Hurd was 10-for-20, with three doubles, eight runs scored, four RBIs, and four walks. The Lynx will return to action this Wednesday with a road game against CBU before taking on conference foe Birmingham Southern this weekend in the final home stand of the season.

Sewanee went 1-2 against Rhodes, with Greg Bartleski pitching his third complete game of the season in the Sunday opener of a doubleheader that rounded out the weekend. The Tigers are 4-17 and 2-4 in league play. Sewanee will host Emory on Wednesday and play at DePauw this weekend in SCAC Eastern Division action.

Southwestern fought its way to a SCAC series win over #23 Millsaps this past weekend. In the opener, the Pirates handed the Majors their worst home loss since the 2000 season by beating them 14-2. SU scored 14 runs on 12 hits and starter Wes Willis held Millsaps to two runs on six hits while striking out 10. The Majors won the first game of Saturday's doubleheader 6-1 with the Southwestern offense struggling to get anything going against MC starter Aaron Williams. SU had four hits with all of them being extra-base hits. In the third game, the Pirates built a 9-3 lead and held on late for a 9-6 victory. Michael Murphy was 3-4 in the game with two doubles and a home run to lead the SU offense. Game four was a tight one that SU pulled out 3-2. First-year Brantley Freeman threw seven innings of two-hit ball and gave up just one earned run while striking out nine. Joe Lange pitched the ninth inning for his first save of the year. The Pirates now stand at 4-4 in the SCAC and 14-16 overall. SU hosts Austin College for a four-game set this weekend.

Trinity went 5-0 last week, including a four-game SCAC weekend sweep at Austin College. The Tigers were down 8-2 heading into the bottom of the seventh inning against McMurry on Tuesday night, then rallied with seven runs over the next two innings to steal a 9-8 victory. Steven Ramos tied the game with an RBI single in the eighth, then Jeff Claydon drove in Ramos with an RBI single for the go-ahead run. The weekend brought a matchup of the two top teams in the SCAC West Division, both of which were tied atop the standings coming into the series. Trinity was swept in three games last year against Austin College, but returned the favor with a four-game SCAC sweep this weekend. Brian Oates struck out a career-high 15 batters in the opener against Austin College, leading the team to a 6-2 win on Friday night. Evan Bronson threw six shutout innings in a 12-0 win to open a Saturday doubleheader, then the Tigers held on for a wild 14-6 win in game two. The series concluded with Trinity's 8-1 win on Sunday afternoon. Trinity scored three or more runs in seven different innings over the four-game series, including an eight-run inning and a six-run inning. The eight-run inning on Saturday tied for the highest total for Trinity this season, while the six-run inning is tied for the second-highest total this season. With the wins this weekend, Trinity clinched a spot in the SCAC Divisional Playoffs, which will be held in Millington, Tennessee, on April 18-20.
