## SCAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Games of October 1 – October 7

**KATIE SLIMP OF RHODES COLLEGE**, a senior forward from Houston, Texas, has been selected the SCAC Field Hockey Offensive Player-of-the-Week for matches played Monday, October 1 through Sunday, October 7.

**Slimp** scored two goals for the Lynx, including the game-winner in overtime, in Saturday's 4-3 victory over Sewanee. The two goals were her fourth and fifth of the season and the senior is second on the team in both goals and points. The second goal against Sewanee was **Slimp's** second game-winner this season.

*Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:*

Sophomore forward/midfielder Mary Kate Clodius of Centre scored a hat-trick in the second half of a 6-0 win over Hendrix College and played a solid game in the Colonel's first conference loss in double-overtime against Rhodes. Clodius came off the bench for the Colonels in both contests this weekend and has been a valuable contributor the entire season. She is currently tied for fourth in the SCAC in scoring. Senior forward Marcy Tickner of Sewanee scored her fifth goal of the season as the Tigers shutout Hendrix 3-0 in Sunday's game. Tickner also scored in the second half of the Rhodes game to bring the Tigers back from a 2-0 deficit which eventually led to a 3-3 tie and overtime. Tickner's tenacity on attack has been amazing all season, as she has played every minute of the last four games, three of which ended in overtime. Tickner also has three assists on the season. First-year forward Katie Sowar of DePauw scored two goals in the Tigers' two wins over the weekend. Sowar scored her first goal of the season to tie the game for the Tigers in an eventual 3-2 double overtime victory against Wooster, and she scored her second goal of the season against Transylvania on Sunday, Sowar improved her shooting percentage to .500 on the weekend. Playing several positions on the forward line this weekend, Sowar was part of an offensive unit that generated eight goals, 46 shots and 37 penalty corners for the weekend. Hendrix did not nominate anyone for the award.

## SCAC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**O'BRIEN WOLFF OF RHODES COLLEGE**, a senior defender from Louisville, Ky., has been selected the SCAC Field Hockey Defensive Player-of-the-Week for matches played Monday, October 1 through Sunday, October 7.

**Wolff** controlled the pace for the Lynx this weekend in two overtime victories. She was instrumental on both ends of the field for Rhodes in the team's 4-3 overtime victory over Sewanee and 1-0 double-overtime upset of Centre. **Wolff** contributed a goal in the Sewanee game to put the Lynx up with 1:14 to play and anchored the defense that held Centre scoreless for the first time this season.

*Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:*

Junior goalkeeper Clarkie Crawford of Sewanee had an outstanding weekend again as she faced 20 shots and recorded 14 saves in Saturday's 4-3 overtime loss against tough SCAC opponent Rhodes College. Crawford's outstanding play once again took the Tigers into overtime for the third game in a row. She had a perfect game on Sunday, recording four saves and earning the shutout in a 3-0 win against conference opponent Hendrix College. Sophomore defender Becca Rojek of DePauw was a key contributor for the Tiger defense that gave up only 15 shots and eight penalty corners over 160 minutes of play this weekend. Showing great skill in tackling and ball distribution, Rojek played every minute this weekend, and has in all of the Tigers' games thus far this year. Junior back Emily Boyle of Centre played two solid games against Hendrix College and Rhodes College in SCAC play this past weekend. Boyle helped limit both opponents to nine combined shots on the weekend and was pivotal in jump-starting the Centre attack out of the backfield. Hendrix did not nominate anyone for the award.

### AROUND THE SCAC

**Centre** finished a grueling stretch of games this past week against NCAA D-II opponent Bellarmine and SCAC rivals Hendrix and Rhodes. Centre suffered its first loss of the season at Bellarmine 4-2 in an evenly played match, but the Knights execution on offensive penalty corners was the difference with all four of the scores coming from penalty corners. The Colonels bounced back against Hendrix winning 6-0 and posting the team's sixth shutout of the season. Sophomore roommates Mary Kate Clodius and Rachel Watkins recorded five of the Colonels six goals on the day, with senior Taylor Gray adding the other. On Sunday, Centre hosted Rhodes with senior day festivities occurring before the match. Centre out-shot Rhodes (13-6) and earned more penalty corners (14-9), but was unable to put a goal in for the first time all season, losing 1-0 to the Lynx in double overtime. The match was the Colonels seventh in only sixteen days.

**DePauw** posted two non-conference victories last week, defeating Wooster, 3-2 in overtime on Saturday and Transylvania 5-2 on Sunday. The Tigers have now won six straight. DePauw dominated both contests, out-shooting Wooster 26-10 with a commanding 17-2 edge in penalty corners on Saturday and out-shooting Transylvania 20-5 with a 20-6 edge in penalty corners on Sunday. Beth Seegers and Katie Sowar both had a goal in each contest and Sarah Riffle had two goals against Transy. Seegers also had an assist. Ashley Fehr had the game-winner in overtime against Wooster and assisted on the game-winner against Transy. DePauw returns to SCAC play with road matches at Rhodes on Friday and Hendrix on Sunday.

**Hendrix** was blanked twice, losing 6-0 at Centre on Saturday and 3-0 at Sewanee on Sunday. Although she allowed nine goals on the weekend, keeper Alyssa Havens added to her impressive season's saves total with 13 against Centre and 20 more against Sewanee to give her an even 100 for the season – already the sixth-most in a single-season in SCAC history. Havens currently averages 11.11 saves per game. No keeper in league history has averaged 10+ saves a game for an entire season. The Warriors play their fifth consecutive road match with a trip to Lindenwood (Mo.) on Friday.

After two early disappointing conference losses, **Rhodes** got back on track this weekend with two victories on the road over Sewanee and Centre. The Lynx match against Sewanee was a 4-3 overtime thriller with plenty of scoring, including penalty corner goals by defenders Maria Cowley and O'Brien Wolff as well as two goals (including the game-winner) by Katie Slimp. After the win the Lynx went on to defeat Centre in a 1-0 double overtime game with the game-winner being scored by freshman and the team's leading scorer, Erin Atmar, after a great run and assist from Lindsey Gurokovich. Rhodes is the first DIII team to beat Centre and the first team to hold them scoreless as well. The Lynx benefited from great defense in both games led by the outstanding play of Kristen Lee, Maria Cowley, O'Brien Wolff, and freshman sweeper Grier Haney.

**Sewanee** lost a tough 4-3 overtime decision to Rhodes on Saturday but rebounded with a 3-0 shutout of Hendrix on Sunday. Sewanee overcame a two-goal deficit to send Saturday's contest into overtime. Sewanee rookie Hope Johnson scored her first collegiate goal just over a minute into the second half off a rebound on a shot by Taylor Skeen and Marcy Tickner added a second goal nine minutes later on a deflection off of Carly Grimm. Rhodes appeared to have the game locked up with a goal with less than one minute remaining, but Sewanee earned a corner with almost no time left on the clock. With time run out, Clare Ashburn scored off a rebound to tie the game 3. In Sunday's victory over Hendrix, Sewanee out-shot the Warriors 35-6 and had 15 penalty corners to five for Hendrix.
