## SCAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Games of October 8 – October 14

**MARCY TICKNER OF SEWANEE-UNIVERSITY OF THE SOUTH**, a senior forward from Rockville, Md., has been selected the SCAC Field Hockey Offensive Player-of-the-Week for matches played Monday, October 8 through Sunday, October 14.

**Tickner** made senior day one to remember, scoring the game-tying and then game-winning goals in Friday's 3-2 upset win over first-place Centre College. **Tickner's** final goal gave her 20 for her career and made her one of just four players in SCAC history to total 20+ career goals. For the season, Tickner has seven goals and four assists for 18 points (tied for fourth in the SCAC).

### Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:

First-year forward Sarah Riffle of DePauw scored three goals on the week, including the go-ahead goal to give the Tigers a 3-2 lead at the half in an eventual 4-3 loss in strokes at Rhodes on Friday. She added two goals in an 8-0 win at Hendrix on Sunday. First-year center midfielder Charlie Wagner of Rhodes scored the game-tying goal with 17 minutes to play in Lynx' 4-3 penalty stroke victory over DePauw. She also sealed the win for the Lynx by making her penalty stroke which was the fourth make for the team out of five players. Wagner controlled the offensive play for the Lynx and was also an integral piece on corner offense. Wagner's goal was her fourth of the season, and she is third on the team in points with 11. Junior forward Teresa Johnstone of Centre posted three shots and an assist in Centre's 3-2 loss at Sewanee this week. Johnstone leads the Colonels in goals (8) and is second in assists (6) on the season. Hendrix did not nominate anyone for the award.

## SCAC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**CLARKIE CRAWFORD OF SEWANEE-UNIVERSITY OF THE SOUTH**, a junior goalkeeper from Louisville, Ky., has been selected the SCAC Field Hockey Defensive Player-of-the-Week for matches played Monday, October 8 through Sunday, October 14.

**Crawford** had an another outstanding game as she backstopped the Tigers to a 3-2 upset over first-place Centre on Friday.

**Crawford** faced 15 shots and had 12 saves. She played a perfect second half, coming up with eight of her 12 saves in the period while allowing no goals in order to secure the one goal win for the Tigers.

### Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:

First-year defender Rachel Webb of Rhodes had an outstanding defensive effort for the Lynx on Friday. After three first half goals by DePauw, Webb moved from the midfield into the defense to help the Lynx control the Tigers' speedy attack. With Webb's assistance the Lynx were able to hold DePauw to just eight shots and without a goal in the second half and both overtime periods. Webb played almost all of both overtime periods and was integral to the Lynx' success in seven-a-side play. Senior defender Ashley Distler of Centre stopped a number of Sewanee attacking opportunities this past week. She did a good job directing from the backfield but Centre was unable to keep the Tigers at bay in the 3-2 loss. DePauw and Hendrix did not nominate anyone for the award.

**AROUND THE SCAC**

**Centre** dropped its only match of the week – a 3-2 decision at Sewanee on Friday. The two split their matches this season with both squads winning on their home turf. Teresa Johnstone posted three shots and assisted on a goal in the loss. She leads the Colonels in goal this season with eight and is second in assists with six for 22 total points – the most points scored in a single season by a Centre player in the SCAC era (2004 to present). Her 20 career goals makes her just the fourth player in league history to score 20+ goals. Centre is off this week and finishes regular season play the following week with road matches at Transy (Oct.23) and its regular season conference finale at DePauw (Oct. 27).

**DePauw** split its two SCAC contests, losing a tough 4-3 decision to Rhodes in a game decided on penalty strokes. The Tigers bounced back with an 8-0 blanking of Hendrix. Meredith Ellis, Carolyn Mueller and Sarah Riffle all had first-half goals for the Tigers to take a 3-2 lead at the break, but that would be the last score DePauw would manage. It was the first game this season involving DePauw that has been decided on strokes. The Tigers got two goals each from Ellis, Riffle and Jackie Smith in Sunday's easy win. Goalkeeper Liz Attewell picked up her second shutout of the season. DePauw plays at Bellarmine (Tuesday) and at Washington & Lee (Thursday) in non-conference play this week.

**Hendrix** played under the lights Friday night for a non-conference contest at Lindenwood (Mo.) University near St. Louis. The Warriors continue to improve in their inaugural season but was unable to rally for the win and fell by the 4-0 score to the host Lions. Hendrix hosted DePauw on Sunday in SCAC play and was defeated 8-0. Finding the net has been the main problem for the team this season. Hendrix has been shutout in 10 of its 11 matches and has scored just one goal this season. The Warriors try to pick up that elusive first win on Saturday at Rhodes. Two of the team's final three matches are against the Lynx.

**Rhodes** got some measure of revenge against DePauw on Friday after an overtime loss two weeks ago in Greencastle. The first half of the game was eventful, as DePauw led 3-2 at the break. Freshman Lindsey Gurkovich scored both of Rhodes' first-half goals. The Lynx rallied to tie the game with 17 minutes to play on a goal by another freshman – Charlie Wagner. Seniors Sara Haney and Katie Slimp both earned assists for the Lynx in regulation play. After two scoreless overtime periods, Rhodes won the game 4-3 in penalty strokes – converting an impressive 4 of 5 strokes. Jenny Mueller, O'Brien Wolff, Maria Cowley, and Charlie Wagner all converted on their attempts. DePauw was able to convert on only twice against Lynx goalkeeper Julz Anderson. Statistically, Rhodes dominated play, out-shooting DePauw 26-13 while holding an 18-8 advantage in penalty corners.

**Sewanee** upset first-place Centre, 3-2, in the Tigers' only match of the week on Friday. At 7-4, Sewanee needs just one more win to assure itself of the program's first winning season since the SCAC began recognizing the sport in 2004. Senior forward Marcy Tickner had two goals on senior day on the Mountain, including the game-winner, and now has seven on the season (tied for fourth in the SCAC). After her two goal weekend, Tickner joins Centre's Johnstone as one of the four players in league history with 20+ career goals. Centre led 2-1 at the half, but Sewanee goalkie Clarkie Crawford had eight of her 12 saves in the second half and kept the Colonels out of the box. The Tigers are off this week, but return to play Friday, Oct. 26 at Transylvania and Sunday, Oct. 28 at DePauw in the regular season finale for both teams.
