AROUND THE SCAC

Centre finished in third place after losing to Sewanee, 1-0, in Saturday's semifinals and rebounding with a win over top-seeded Rhodes, 3-1, on Sunday. Teresa Johnstone's goal on Sunday was her fourth career goal in SCAC Tournament play – making her the league's all-time leader in that category. Rachel Watkins had a goal and an assist in the win and her goal was the game-winner. The Colonels, the No. 1 team in the Great Lakes Region heading into the SCAC tourney, was rewarded for their record-breaking season with an at-large berth in this week's NCAA Field Hockey Championship Tournament – the first SCAC school to ever earn a bid to the postseason tourney. Johnstone's 26 points this season are the third-most in a single-season in SCAC history. Taylor Gray's 10 assists this season – she had one in the SCAC Tournament – are the most ever in a SCAC single-season.

DePauw won its first-ever SCAC Field Hockey Championship – defeating Sewanee, 3-1, in the title game. The Tigers earned the "Cup" on the strength of goals from Carolyn Mueller, Meredith Ellis and Katie Sogar, who delivered the game-winning goal with just under seven minutes remaining in regulation. DePauw out-shot Sewanee 25-14 while Sewanee held a 9-8 edge in corners. DePauw's Liz Attewell totaled 11 saves. DePauw advanced to Sunday's championship game after defeating Centre, 1-0, on Saturday as Beth Seegers supplied the only goal of the contest.

Hendrix lost 3-0 to fourth-seeded University of the South in the first round of the SCAC Championship Tournament Friday afternoon at Sewanee. The Warriors end its inaugural season of field hockey with an 0-15 overall record and 0-8 SCAC mark. Hendrix was out-shot 22-2 in the Sewanee match. First-year midfielder Lexy Byrne and forward Abby Coleman recorded the team's only shots in the tilt.

Rhodes did not finish its season the way it hoped as the top seed was defeated twice and had to settle for a fourth-place finish at the SCAC Tournament. The Lynx, who led the SCAC in scoring during the regular season, managed just one goal on the weekend – a score by Morgan Jane Mischer in Sunday's loss to Centre in the consolation round. First-year forward Erin Atmar finished the season as the league leader in goals with 11 – the third-highest single-season in SCAC history. She shared the points title with Centre's Teresa Johnstone.

Sewanee advanced to the title game for the first time since 2004, but fell just short of capturing its first SCAC Field Hockey Championship – losing to DePauw, 3-1, in the finals. It was almost a fairy tale ending for head coach Barb Taylor and her fourth-seeded squad, as Sunday's title match was her last as head coach of the Tigers. Marcy Tickner and Lynn Hancock had incredible tournaments as Tickner had a goal and a tournament record three assists while Hancock added two goals. Clarkie Crawford had two shutouts in the tournament – blanking Hendrix on Friday and Centre on Saturday with six saves combined. Tickner finished the season with 25 points – the most points for a Sewanee player in a single season in the SCAC era.
