**NCAA 1-AA NAT. OFFENSIVE.**  
**MICHAEL JEFFERSON, SR. WR. 6'2, 205. MONTANA STATE UNIVERSITY:** Jefferson hauled in 12 catches for a school-record 239 yards and scored a touchdown on Montana State's 39-32 road victory over Northern Arizona. Jefferson had four catches of 20 yards or more. The transfer from Arizona hauled in a 24-yard catch on MSU's game-winning touchdown drive.  
**NCAA 1-AA NAT. OFFENSIVE. DURAN LAWSON, JR. QB. 6'0, 191. THE CITADEL:** Lawson became the first Citadel quarterback to throw for more than 300 yards since 2003. Lawson orchestrated an offense that put over 300 yards on the board in the first half and vaulted the Bulldogs to a 24-7 lead. He leads the conference in total offense with an average of 220.2 yards a game. In the 24-21 win over Chattanooga he completed 24-of-32 passes for 324 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for 27 yards on 11 carries.  
**NCAA 1-AA NAT. OFFENSIVE. RICKY SANTOS, JR. QB. 6'2, 215. UNIVERSITY OF NEW HAMPSHIRE:** Santos completed 21-of-30 passes for 281 yards and three touchdowns and added a game-high 110 rushing yards and two scores in New Hampshire's 52-49 victory at Delaware. He has not thrown an interception in 102 pass attempts this season. Santos became the program's all-time passing yardage leader with 8,008 in 30 games, surpassing the previous mark of 7,742, held by Bob Jean (1985-88).  
**NCAA 1-AA NAT. OFFENSIVE. TYLER THIGPEN, SR. QB. 6'3, 220. COASTAL CAROLINA UNIVERSITY:** Thigpen was 19-of-26 passing for 279 yards and a school-record four touchdowns in Coastal's 31-12 win at Winston-Salem State. He finished with a 213.98 passing efficiency against the Rams. Thigpen also rushed for team-high 57 yards and finished the day with 336 yards of total offense. He became the Big South's all-time leading quarterback rusher during the contest, finished with 1,233 to pass Gardner-Webb's Nick Roberts (1,182).  
**NCAA 1-AA NAT. DEFENSIVE. MARIO E. BROWN, SO. LB. 6'2, 234. GARDNER-WEBB UNIVERSITY:** Brown broke the Big South single-game mark for total tackles against Southeastern Louisiana with 25 hits in Gardner-Webb's 28-21 win. Brown's third quarter interception and 21-yard return set up a G-W touchdown. Late in the game, he stopped a Lions' receiver for just a one yard gain on third and five inside the GWU six-yard line, and then forced the quarterback to overthrow on Brown's 15 solo tackles are also a career-high, and he finished the day with a personal-best three tackles for loss and two quarterback hurries.  
**NCAA 1-AA NAT. DEFENSIVE. COREY WEAVER, SO. LB. 6'1, 210. ELON UNIVERSITY:** Weaver amassed a game-high and career-high 25 tackles in Elon's 45-21 loss at Appalachian State in front of a stadium-record 26,620 Homecoming fans. He also recorded 5 sacks. Those 25 tackles mark the most by an Elon player since teammate Chad Nking achieved that same tally against Chattanooga last season.  
**NCAA 1-AA NAT. DEFENSIVE. ZAIRE WILBORN, JR. DB/LB. 5'10, 200. FRAMINGHAM STATE UNIVERSITY:** Wilborn registered nine tackles, including 4.5 tackles for loss with two sacks as GSU defeated Prairie View A&M 53-7. He also forced a fumble and returned a fumble 71 yards for a touchdown.  
**NCAA 1-AA NAT. SPECIAL TEAMS. PARKER DOUGLASS, JR. K. 5'8, 170. SOUTH DAKOTA STATE UNIVERSITY:** Douglass made 4-of-5 field goal attempts, including the 46-yard game-winner with 14 seconds left, as South Dakota State upset No. 16 McNeese State 20-17. Douglass also connected from 40, 41 and 32 yards, while missing from 49. He set a couple of Jackrabbits school records on the night as he upped his career field goal total to 38, including passing Brett Gordon (36 field goals from 1995-98) for the Jackrabbits career lead. His 12 points gave him 191 for his career as he surpassed the school scoring mark by a kicker previously held by Adam Vinatieri (185 from 1991-94).  
**NCAA 1-AA NAT. SPECIAL TEAMS. MITCH LIVELY, SR. P. 6'4, 220. SACRAMENTO STATE UNIVERSITY:** Lively averaged 47.1 yards per punt on seven kicks in the Hornets' 21-20 victory over Eastern Washington. Lively drilled a career-long 65-yarder in the first half. Lively leads the Big Sky Conference and is fourth in the nation in punting with an average of 43.23.  
**NCAA 1-AA NAT. SPECIAL TEAMS. WESLEY TAYLOR, JR. P/PK. 5'7, 170. FLORIDA A&M UNIVERSITY:** Taylor nailed a 34-yard field goal in overtime to give FAMU a 25-22 win over Tennessee State. Taylor was 4-of-6 on field goal attempts for the game, connecting on field goals of 42, 47, 36 and 34 yards. He also had three punts for 127 yards, averaging 42.3 yards per punt.

**NCAA 1-AA NAT. OFFENSIVE. LINEMAN. CHRIS SULLIVAN, SR. OL. 5'11, 265. WESTERN KENTUCKY UNIVERSITY:** Sullivan received a 94-percent overall grade with a 93-percent production mark following the Hilltoppers' 38-35 victory over Western Illinois, while accounting for 10 knockdown downs. He did not allow a sack and was not called for a penalty as his efforts helped WKU post season highs with 202 yards rushing, 257 yards passing, 469 yards of total offense and 38 points.  
**NCAA 1-AA NAT. OFFENSIVE. LINEMAN. EMANUEL SWINDELL, SR. LT. 6'5, 290. NORFOLK STATE UNIVERSITY:** Swindell led a Norfolk State offense that compiled a season-high 439 yards of offense in the win over North Carolina A&T 42-20. Swindell graded out at 93-percent by his coaches on assignments, with no sacks allowed and no penalties.  
**NCAA 1-AA MID-MAJOR NAT. OFFENSIVE. JOSH JOHNSON, JR. QB. 6'3, 195. UNIVERSITY OF SAN DIEGO:** Johnson compiled 437 yards total offense, the second-most total offensive yards in 1-AA in 2006, while leading San Diego to a 50-21 victory at Davidson. Johnson completed 27-of-39 passes for 310 yards and four touchdowns. He then carried the ball 11 times for 117 yards, including a 20-yard touchdown. That 117-yard rushing total is the most by a Division I-AA quarterback this season. Johnson is the first Torero quarterback to pass for 300 yards and rush for 100 yards in the same contest.  
**NCAA 1-AA MID-MAJOR NAT. DEFENSIVE. MIKE MARZOTTO, JR. LB. 6'2, 235. BUTLER UNIVERSITY:** Marzotto recorded a team-high 13 tackles, including nine solo stops, to help lead Butler to a 23-20 victory against Dayton. Marzotto had three tackles for loss as part of his 13-tackle effort, including two quarterback sacks. He also added a pass break-up.  
**NCAA 1-AA MID-MAJOR NAT. DEFENSIVE. CHAD WENGERT, JR. LB. 6'0, 240. ROBERT MORRIS UNIVERSITY:** Wengert tied a career-high with nine tackles in a 45-13 victory over St. Francis (PA), including three solo stops. He also recorded two pass break-ups at the line of scrimmage and one tackle-for-loss. He helped sealed the victory for Robert Morris by intercepting Red Flash quarterback Anthony Doria and rumbling 20 yards for a touchdown.  
**NCAA 1-AA MID-MAJOR NAT. SPECIAL TEAMS. CYRUS MADDOX, SR. P. 6'3, 215. DAVIDSON COLLEGE:** Maddox booted five punts for 247 yards (49.4 ypp) in Davidson's loss to San Diego. His 49.4 yards per punt average was the highest single-game average for a Wildcats punter in the last 30 seasons. He recorded back-to-back 72 and 63 yard punts in the third quarter, both with no return. His 72-yard boot broke the Davidson school record, set in 1965. He forced touchbacks on two of his four kickoffs.  
**NCAA 1-AA MID-MAJOR NAT. SPECIAL TEAMS. JAMES BELL, SR. QB. 6'3, 210. WEST TEXAS A&M UNIVERSITY:** Bell spearheaded the No. 7 Buffs' as he threw for a season-high 473 yards (32-for-48) and five touchdowns as WTAMU rolled up 659 yards of total offense.  
**NCAA II NAT. OFFENSIVE. WILLIE COPELAND, JR. QB. 6'3, 190. VALDOSTA STATE UNIVERSITY:** Copeland led the Blazers to a 49-21 win over Ouachita Baptist. He completed 24-of-30 passes, including his first nine attempts, for 332 yards and five touchdowns.  
**NCAA II NAT. OFFENSIVE. DANNY WOODHEAD, JR. TB. 5'9, 200. CHADRON STATE COLLEGE:** Woodhead carried the ball 17 times for 275 yards (16.2-yard average) and four touchdowns during the Eagles' 40-20 victory over New Mexico Highlands. His touchdown runs covered 41, 13, 38 and 45 yards. For the season, Woodhead has 1,120 yards on 127 carries for an 8.8-yard average. He has caught 14 passes for 132 yards. He has scored 16 touchdowns. He became CSC's all-time leading rusher and has carried 889 times for 4,729 yards (6.8-yard average) and 61 touchdowns. He has caught 60 passes for 662 yards (11.0-yard average) and three more touchdowns.  
**NCAA II NAT. DEFENSIVE. DARREN BANKS, JR. DB. 5'11, 180. WEST LIBERTY STATE COLLEGE:** Banks intercepted three passes in the Hilltoppers' 21-19 win over I-AA Duquesne. He also led West Liberty with seven tackles.  
**NCAA II NAT. DEFENSIVE. ALVIN HUDSON, SO. LB. 6'3, 210. LIVINGSTONE COLLEGE:** Hudson totaled 17 tackles, including 5 tackles for loss of five yards in the 18-14 loss to Shaw. He also recovered one fumble and returned it 15 yards for a touchdown. Livingstone blocked a punt

and Hudson recovered the ball on the 15 and returned it for the first score of the game.  
**NCAA II NAT. DEFENSIVE. JAKE RICHTER, JR. S. 5'11, 190. EMPORIA STATE UNIVERSITY:** Richter logged the MIAA's first 20-tackle game of the season with a career-high 21 stops in ESU's 59-57, four overtime loss to Pittsburg State. He had 14 solo tackles, the most by a Hornet since 1997. He also had an 18-yard interception return which led to a touchdown and halted a run of 24 straight Gorilla points, and forced a fumble.  
**NCAA II NAT. DEFENSIVE. KEVIN RIGBY, SR. OLB. 6'2, 215. CLARION UNIVERSITY:** Rigby 13 tackles, including four tackles for loss (-7 yards), two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, one interception and one pass defended. His fumble caused and recovered in the first quarter set up Clarion's first touchdown to give the Eagles a 7-0 lead. In the second quarter he intercepted a pass and returned it 26 yards to the Slippery Rock 22-yard line.  
**NCAA II NAT. DEFENSIVE. ROBERT TOWNS, SR. DB. 5'11, 200. HARDING UNIVERSITY:** Towns spearheaded the Bisons defense in a 24-16 home victory over West Alabama, grabbing three interceptions for 44 return yards, tallying seven total tackles behind five solos and adding two pass breakups. Towns became the first Harding player to have two three-interception games in a career nabbing three interceptions against Arkansas Tech last year.  
**NCAA II NAT. SPECIAL TEAMS. JONATHAN HAWKS, SR. WR. 5'8, 165. BEMIDJI STATE UNIVERSITY:** Hawks had two kickoff returns for 169 yards, with a 69-yard return to set up a fourth-quarter touchdown which helped tie the score at 15 and an NCAA record-tying 100-yard touchdown return to give BSU a 25-22 lead with 4:20 to play in the game. Hawks added two receptions to 20 yards.  
**NCAA II NAT. OFFENSIVE. LINEMAN. TAVERAS DISHMON, SR. OL. 6'3, 300. KENTUCKY STATE UNIVERSITY:** Dishmon graded out a perfect 100-percent on run plays and 99-percent on pass protection in KSU's 22-9 win over Clark Atlanta.  
**NCAA II NAT. ALL-PURPOSE. DAMON LINDSAY, SR. WR/KR. 6'1, 185. GLENVILLE STATE COLLEGE:** Lindsay opened the scoring in Glenville State's 21-13 win over Kentucky Wesleyan with an 80-yard punt return for a touchdown. He finished the day with 81 punt return yards on three attempts. Lindsay also added 139 yards and two touchdowns on six receptions.  
**NCAA III NAT. OFFENSIVE. ALBY COOMBS, SR. RB. 6'0, 210. KENYON COLLEGE:** Coombs rushed for 207 yards on 34 carries and scored four touchdowns in the Lords 44-42 win over Ohio Wesleyan. The win was the Lords first over Ohio Wesleyan since 1988 and the four scores tied the Lords record.  
**NCAA III NATIONAL OFFENSIVE. DANNY JONES, JR. QB. 6'2, 205. CALIFORNIA LUTHERAN UNIVERSITY:** Jones led the Kingsmen to a 55-12 victory over La Verne as he threw for a career-high five touchdowns, while he rushed for two more. He completed 17-of-24 passes for 295 yards with no interceptions. His passing efficiency rating for the game was 242.8 set last year against Chapman. Jones has led the Kingsmen to 10 straight victories and 16 wins in their last 17 games.  
**NCAA III NAT. OFFENSIVE. JUAN JOSEPH, SO. QB. 6'2, 178. MILLSAPS COLLEGE:** Joseph passed for a school-record tying five touchdown passes as the Majors posted a 52-10 thumping of Lincoln (MO) University in front of a hungry Millsaps crowd on "Purple Pride Day". He completed 18-of-35 passes for 275 yards, and is the first Millsaps quarterback to throw five touchdowns in a single game since Beau Pollard led the Majors to a 52-16 win over Greenville in 1997. Joseph has completed 50-of-91 passes for a league-leading 756 yards and nine touchdowns.  
**NCAA III NAT. OFFENSIVE. JOSH VOGELBACH, SO. QB. 5'11, 200. GUILFORD COLLEGE:** Vogelbach set a school record with six touchdown passes on the Kings' 49-35 victory over Ferrum. He completed 31-of-46 passes for 338 yards, marking his seventh-straight 300-plus yard passing game. He also rushed for 12 yards on two carries.  
**NCAA III NAT. OFFENSIVE. CHRIS SHARPE, JR. QB. 5'9, 204. SPRINGFIELD COLLEGE:** Sharpe carried 20 times for 235 yards and a school record-tying five touchdowns in a 31-24 win over Alfred. He scored the clincher on a 15-yard touchdown run on fourth down and 1:32 left in the game, taking the ball back from his running back. Sharpe is now ranked #1 in the

of nation in rushing (214.7 ypg) and #1 in the nation in scoring (22.0 ppg) in Division III.  
**NCAA III NATIONAL DEFENSIVE. KEVIN WILLIAMSON, SR. FB. 5'10, 215. CONCORDIA COLLEGE-MOORHEAD:** Williamson tied a school record for most touchdowns in a single game as he ran for five touchdowns, including the game-winner in overtime, in the Cobbers' 34-28 victory over Augsburg. He finished with 178 rushing yards on 31 carries. Williamson needs only three more touchdowns to break the school record for touchdowns in a career.  
**NCAA III NATIONAL DEFENSIVE. TODD FAIRLIE, SR. S. 5'9, 170. WIDENER UNIVERSITY:** Fairlie picked off three passes and added eight tackles in Widener's 20-16 victory over Moravian. His first interception, a diving play at Moravian's 26-yard line, set up a field goal. He added a 42-yard interception return early in the second half at Widener's 10-yard line to kill a rally. His third interception had him staying with the receiver on an end-around/option and interception a deep pass with 1:19 left to play in the game.  
**NCAA III NATIONAL DEFENSIVE. MATT JOHNSON, JR. LB. 6'3, 208. CENTRE COLLEGE:** Johnson posted a season-high 15 tackles in a 14-0 shutout of Sewanee. He also added a sack, 15 tackles for loss, broke up a pass and returned an interception 29 yards to the Tigers one-yard line. Johnson leads the SCAC in tackles (54) and is averaging 10.8 stops per game. He led the league last year with 112 total stops.  
**NCAA III NATIONAL DEFENSIVE. JUSTIN SPARRGROVE, JR. DL. 6'2, 225. LORAS COLLEGE:** Sparrgrove helped anchor a Loras defense that forced two turnovers and sacked the Coe quarterback five times in a 32-30 win over nationally-ranked Coe College. His totals for the game were eight total tackles, including three tackles for loss (23-yards) with 2.5 sacks (-15 yards) and one interception.  
**NCAA III NATIONAL DEFENSIVE. KEONE TAWATA, JR. LB. 5'11, 200. LINFIELD COLLEGE:** Tawata led the Wildcats with 15 tackles, intercepted two passes, returning one 40 yards for a touchdown, and recovered a fumble as Linfield took out Willamette 42-14 in conference action.  
**NCAA III NATIONAL DEFENSIVE. MIKE SIRIGNANO, SR. DT. 6'3, 260. BRIDGEWATER STATE COLLEGE:** Sirignano recorded a career-high 19 tackles (14 solo), with a career-high 4.5 sacks and a forced fumble, as BSC defeated Maine Maritime 28-21. His forced fumble was the second of back-to-back turnovers by the Bears which turned a 7-0 deficit into a 14-7 lead in a matter of 78 seconds in the first quarter.  
**NCAA NATIONAL SPECIAL TEAMS. GEOFF TROY, SO. P/K. 6'2, 195. U.S.MERCHANT MARINE ACADEMY:** Troy broke John ReShore's previous record of 48 yards set on Oct. 5, 1974, with his 50 yard boot. He also made a 37-yard field goal in the game and was 2-for-2 in extra point kicks. Troy also punted seven times for a 39.3 yard average, including a long of 44 yards. He pinned Union inside their own 20-yard line three times.  
**NCAA III NATIONAL SPECIAL TEAMS. BRANT VER MEER, SR. P. 6'2, 210. CENTRAL COLLEGE:** VerMeer in a defensive struggle on a windy day, pinned Wartburg inside its 20-yard line on five of nine punts, including two punts that went out of bounds at the 6-yard line, another that went out of bounds at the 3-yard line and a crucial fourth-quarter punt that was downed at the 1-yard line. He had nine punts for an average of 38.7 yards, including a long of 52 yards with five for no returns in the 13-7 win.  
**NCAA III NATIONAL SPECIAL TEAMS. JESSE WENDT, SR. KR/WR. 6'3, 230. UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN-STOUT:** Wendt returned a kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown to push the lead to UW-Stout's side of the scoreboard (27-24). He finished with three kickoff returns for 135 yards and also hauled in one pass for nine yards as UW-Stout lost a close one to UW-Platteville, 31-27.  
**NCAA III NAT. ALL-PURPOSE. WALNER BELLEUS, SR. DB/KR/WR. 5'11, 179. UNIVERSITY OF DUBUQUE:** Belleus amassed 331 all-purpose yards and three touchdowns to go along with nine tackles and an interception in Dubuque's 51-34 victory over Luther. He had six receptions for 123 yards and a touchdown, returned two kickoffs for 105 yards, including an 88-yard touchdown and returned one punt for a 73-yard touchdown. Belleus returned the interception 22 yards, had one carry for eight yards and forced a fumble.  
**NCAA III NAT. ALL-PURPOSE. ADAMIS GONZALEZ, SR. WR/KR/5'5, 155. WESTERN CONNECTICUT STATE UNIVERSITY:** Gonzalez accumulated 221 all-purpose yards in the Colonials' 24-17 road

loss to Rowan. He produced three kickoff returns for a total of 119 yards, including a 90-yard touchdown return. He also garnered two punt returns for four yards and added nine receptions for 98 yards. Gonzalez currently leads the NJAC in all-purpose yards per game with an average of 158.9.  
**NAIA NATIONAL OFFENSIVE. JOSH GARZA, SO. QB. 5'11, 185. LAMBUTH UNIVERSITY:** Garza had 243 total offensive yards for the Eagles at Cumberland (TN), completing 9-of-12 passes for 132 yards and two touchdowns and had 19 carries for 111 yards and one more touchdown as Lambuth beat Cumberland 41-24.  
**NAIA NATIONAL OFFENSIVE. ERIC HOOKS, SR. QB. 5'11, 208. UNIVERSITY OF SAINT FRANCIS (IN):** Hooks completed 23-of-41 passes for 254 yards and had 10 carries for 29 yards as St. Francis nipped Ohio Dominican 21-17.  
**NAIA NATIONAL OFFENSIVE. DEREK RASMUSSEN, JR. QB. 6'4, 210. EVANGEL UNIVERSITY:** Rasmussen completed 17-of-30 passes for 342 yards and three touchdowns in a 312-10 win over Culver-Stocketon. He had touchdown passes of 89, 59 and 19 yards to help the Crusaders to their third straight win.  
**NAIA NATIONAL DEFENSIVE. ADAM GABRIEL, JR. LB. 6'0, 245. BETHEL (KS) COLLEGE:** Gabriel had 13 total tackles including one tackle for loss (-1 yard) and one interception in BC's 24-21 win over Sterling. He returned his interception for 43 yards.  
**NAIA NATIONAL DEFENSIVE. BUD KEITH, SO. DB. 5'11, 193. SHRTER COLLEGE:** Keith had 10 total tackles in the Hawks 38-14 victory over Campbellville. Keith intercepted a pass in the fourth quarter and returned it 77 yards for a touchdown.  
**NAIA NATIONAL DEFENSIVE. OWEN KOEPPEN, SO. LB. 6'2, 238. CARROLL (MT) COLLEGE:** Koepfen had 11 tackles, one tackle for loss, one quarterback sack and one interception with a 38 yard return as Carroll defeated Montana Tech 16-8.  
**NAIA NATIONAL DEFENSIVE. CHRIS KUEHL, JR. LB. 6'3, 225. MORNINGSIDES COLLEGE:** Kuehl snagged three interceptions in No. 14 Morningside's 37-0 shutout win at Nebraska Wesleyan. The three picks tied a school record, and his third interception of the game was returned 50 yards for a touchdown. Kuehl also had four solo tackles in the game.  
**NAIA NATIONAL SPECIAL TEAMS. MATT BRANCH, SO. P. 5'10, 175. URBANA UNIVERSITY:** Branch averaged 53.6 yards per punt on five punts. Three of the punts were inside the 20 yard line. And had a long punt of 58 yards in the win over Taylor 14-7.  
**NAIA NATIONAL SPECIAL TEAMS. BRAD ELLIOTT, JR. ST. 5'9, 168. VALLEY CITY STATE UNIVERSITY:** Elliott had a 48 yard return for a touchdown among his three punt returns for 73 yards in the Vikings 49-7 romp over Mayville State. He also returned one kick for 28 yards.  
**NAIA NATIONAL SPECIAL TEAMS. BRAD HOLLEN, SO. K/P. 6'2, 185. UNIVERSITY OF MONTANA-WESTERN:** Hollen kicked a career-best 47 yard field goal and was 2-for-2 on PAT's in the loss Rocky Mountain. He had six punts for 269 yards (44.8 average) with a long of 58 yards.  
**NAIA NATIONAL ALL-PURPOSE. KYLE CALLAHAN, SO. WR/QB. 6'1, 198. UNION (KY) COLLEGE:** Callahan completed one pass for seven yards, rushed three times for four yards and caught eight passes for 153 yards and two touchdowns in a 39-17 win over Pikeville.  
**NCCAA NATIONAL OFFENSIVE. KYLE THOMPSON, SO. WR. 6'2, 208. NORTHWESTERN (MN) COLLEGE:** Thompson had eight catches for 109 yards (13.6 yards per catch) and one touchdown in the 17-14 loss to Minnesota-Morris. He also had one carry for seven yards.  
**NCCAA NATIONAL DEFENSIVE. DANIEL PACHECO, JR. DB. 5'10, 185. SOUTHWESTERN ASSEMBLIES OF GOD UNIVERSITY:** Pacheco set a school record with three against McPherson. His first interception in the first quarter to stop a drive. The second came on a hail-mary from McPherson to end the first half. In the third quarter, McPherson was on a drive that could have pulled the Bulldogs to within seven points, but Pacheco intercepted a pass in the endzone to end the drive. He also had five tackles in the 23-3 win over McPherson.
