SCAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Games of August 31 – September 2

JEREMY RIELLEY OF DEPAUW UNIVERSITY, a senior midfielder from Evanston, Ill., has been selected the SCAC Men's Soccer Offensive Player-of-the-Week for matches played from Friday, August 31 through Sunday, September 2.

Rielley scored five goals in wins over Wabash (3-0) and Holy Cross (7-0) as DePauw opened 2-0 for the first time since the 2003 season. **Rielley** had two goals in the first half against in-state rival Wabash and found the back of the net three times in the match's first 18 minutes in Saturday's win against Holy Cross.

Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:

Senior forward Brandon Gish of Centre had a brilliant start to his senior campaign, notching back-to-back goals in Centre's 4-3 victory over 21st-ranked Ohio Northern. Gish demonstrated his superior pace, finishing on two through balls less than three minutes apart. Then on Sunday, Gish and the Colonels out-matched Hanover in a lopsided 3-1 victory. Centre controlled much of the match out-shooting the Panthers 17-4 to go along with a 12-1 advantage in corner kicks. Junior forward Patrick Floeck of Trinity scored three goals on just six shots during the season-opening weekend, helping Trinity to wins over Whitworth and Pacific Lutheran. He scored the first goal in each game, as well as two goals against Pacific Lutheran. It was the fifth multi-goal game of his career. Floeck led the team with 11 goals last season, and finished second on the team with nine goals in nine goals. First-year midfielder Mac Barnes of Hendrix scored two goals and had one assist this week in the Warriors' first two contests. Barnes scored the second goal in the Warriors' 2-0 shutout of East Texas Baptist and assisted their first goal and scored the second in their 5-2 loss to Louisiana College. Barnes' two goals came off of just five shots, all of which were on goal. Sophomore forward Aaron Hyatt of Millsaps delivered the game-tying goal in the Majors' 3-1 season-opening loss to Principia (Ill.), scoring in the 13th minute on goalkeeper Dana Byquist. Hyatt fired two shots for the game, finding the back of the net off an assisted ball from teammate Andres Colochio. The sophomore recorded the fourth goal of his career, after tying for second on the team last season in goals with three. Junior midfielder Miles Vaughn of Austin was at the heart of virtually every Austin College attack from his midfield position, taking shots himself and setting up his teammates for several of the 16 attempts in the game against the University of Dallas. Colorado College, Oglethorpe, Rhodes, Sewanee and Southwestern did not nominate anyone for the award.

SCAC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

NICK DASCOLI OF DEPAUW UNIVERSITY, a senior defender from Indianapolis, Ind., has been selected the SCAC Men's Soccer Defensive Player-of-the-Week for matches played from Friday, August 31 through Sunday, September 2.

Dascoli spearheaded the defensive effort that resulted in two shutouts over the weekend for the Tigers. DePauw's opponents recorded just five shots combined in the two contests.

Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:

Junior sweeper Adam Boyer of Centre anchored the Colonel defense in a pair of wins over the weekend. On Friday night, Boyer and the Colonels consistently thwarted the set-piece attack of the 21st-ranked Ohio Northern Polar Bears to come through with the 4-3 victory. Then on Sunday, Boyer scored the game-winning goal against Hanover College to bring the Colonel's record to 2-0. Boyer and the Centre defense limited the Panthers to just four shots and one corner kick on the day. Senior defender Will Maddox of Trinity helped the Tigers to wins over Whitworth and Pacific Lutheran to open the season. Maddox has not been a regular starter on the Tiger back line in any of his first three seasons, but put forth a standout effort this weekend. He held off a late onslaught from Whitworth, who tried desperately to tie the game in the final minutes, and played an outstanding overall game against Pacific Lutheran. Sophomore keeper Nate Noel of Austin had an outstanding season debut for the 'Roos, stopping seven shots and making several other big plays in a scoreless double overtime draw against the University of Dallas. Noel made several game-saving plays, perhaps most notably in the 88th minute when he batted down what looked to be a sure fire goal on a header and managed to cover up the ball just before it could cross the goal line. Junior goalkeeper Ryan Tasin of Southwestern went 1-0 this past weekend, recording the 2-1 win against Pacific Lutheran University on Saturday. The junior goalie stopped six shots to preserve the victory. On Sunday, Tasin played the second half and both overtime periods as the Pirates shutout Whitworth University for a 0-0 tie. In total, Tasin faced 11 shots on goal and stopped 10 of them. Senior goalkeeper Jake Milner of Millsaps showed signs of promise in the net for the Majors. Milner picked up four saves in the season-opener before a nine-save performance in a 3-0 loss to Washington University (Mo.) on Sunday. The Bears scored all three goals in the second half. Colorado College, Hendrix, Oglethorpe, Rhodes and Sewanee did not nominate anyone for the award.

AROUND THE SCAC

Austin tied its only match of the weekend, a 0-0 draw with University of Dallas on Sunday. Keeper Nate Noel went all 110 minutes in goal allowing nothing past him while securing seven saves. It was the first tie for the Austin men since Nov. 5, 2005 when the 'Roos played to a 1-1 draw against University of the Ozarks in the ASC Tournament. Austin plays host to East Texas Baptist on Wednesday.

Birmingham-Southern opened the 2007 going 1-1 at the Saturn of Charleston Classic hosted by the College of Charleston in Charleston, S.C., last weekend. The Panthers opened the tournament with a 1-0 win over Presbyterian College on Friday. Senior Striker Gino Cozzolino scored on a penalty kick in the second half to break the scoreless tie. Senior keeper Joe Nasco made a diving save off a corner kick situation in the final 30 seconds to preserve the BSC victory. BSC fell victim to three first half goals in a 4-1 loss to host the College of Charleston on Sunday to finish in second place. The Panthers travel to Denver, Colo., Sept. 7 and 9. BSC plays Air Force at 8 p.m. on Friday and host Denver on Sunday at noon.

No. 22 Centre opened its 2007 season with a pair of victories. Following a season in which the program won 10 or more games for the fifth consecutive year, the Colonels started the season with a 4-3 victory over 21st-ranked Ohio Northern on Friday night in Danville. Centre went into the half ahead 3-0 but needed one more from Eric Brown late in the game to prevent an Ohio Northern comeback. The win marked the seventh consecutive season the Colonels have opened their season with a victory. On Sunday, after falling behind 1-0 in the first half, Centre scored three unanswered goals on the road en-route to a 3-1 victory over Hanover. Centre controlled much of the match out-shooting the Panthers 17-4 to go along with a 12-1 advantage in corner kicks. The Colonels travel to Cincinnati, Ohio on Tuesday, to take on the College of Mount St. Joseph.

Colorado College split its two matches to open the 2007 season – defeating Augsburg on Friday (3-0) before falling to UT-Dallas on Sunday (2-0). Sophomore forward Trevor Cobb had two of the Tigers' three goals in Friday's win. On Sunday, Colorado College had a decisive 20-11 advantage in shots and a 7-1 edge in corner kicks, but was unable to solve UTD keeper Jake Brandon. The Tigers will return to action next Saturday and Sunday when they play host to Willamette University and Whittier College. Both games are scheduled for 2 p.m. starts at Stewart Field.

No. 21 DePauw opened the season with victories over Wabash (3-0) and Holy Cross (7-0) – giving the Tigers a 2-0 start to a season for the first time since 2003. Senior midfielder Jeremy Rielley scored five goals in the two contests, including three in the first 18 minutes against Holy Cross. DePauw travels to take on Wittenberg and Earlham this weekend. Under head coach Page Cotton, DePauw has posted 25 straight .500 or better seasons.

Hendrix opened its season with a pair of road games. On Friday, the Warriors got the season started off right with a 2-0 shutout of East Texas Baptist University. Junior Kevin DeStafano and first year midfielder Mac Barnes were responsible for the Warriors' two goals. Senior goalkeeper Kyle Beene had nine saves in the shutout. On Saturday, the Warriors were looking to stay unbeaten but fell to Louisiana College, 5-2. Mac Barnes had another goal and an assist for the Warriors, while sophomore Thatcher Crawford scored the other Hendrix goal. The Warriors will host University of the Ozarks in their 2007 home-opener on Wednesday, travel to Winfield, Kan., on Friday to take on Southwestern College and return home to host the University of Dallas on Sunday.

AROUND THE SCAC

Millsaps sits at 0-2 after two losses at the Rhodes Classic in Memphis. The Majors fell to Principia (3-1) on Saturday and to Washington (Mo.) (3-0) on Sunday. Aaron Hyatt scored Millsaps' lone goal of the weekend on an assist from Andres Colocho to tie Saturday's match at 1. The Majors have the longest current loss streak in the SCAC (five), dating to the 2006 season. Millsaps hopes to snap that streak on Friday at Louisiana College – a team the Majors fell to in Jackson last season by 1-0 overtime decision.

Oglethorpe split its two contests to open the 2007 season, defeating Husson, 6-2, before losing to 3-1, to Mississippi College. The matches were played at Emory University. Danner Marsden and Matt Brisindine both had two goals and an assist (five points) in the victory over Husson. Italo Cardoza had three assists in the game. Evan Britton scored the Petrels only goal against Mississippi College. OU travels to North Carolina this weekend to take on Greensboro and Methodist.

Rhodes split its last two games of the 2006 season – a 2-1 victory at Sewanee and a 3-2 loss at Oglethorpe. The victory against Sewanee is the third straight for the Lynx – all ending as 2-1 wins for Rhodes. After defeating Oglethorpe 12 straight times from 1991-2003, Rhodes has gone 0-2-1 against the Petrels the last three meetings. The team's leading scorer, Logan Eberly, had the game-winning goal as well as an assist in Friday's win against Sewanee and added an assist in Sunday's loss to Oglethorpe. He finishes the season with 11 goals and three assists for 25 points (tied for seventh in the SCAC).

Sewanee dropped both of its matches this past weekend at its own Kyle Rote Jr. Invitational. The Tigers, who lost to sixth-ranked Johns Hopkins and Montreat, are 0-2 to start a season for the first time ever in the SCAC era (1991-forward). Robbie Wynne had the team's only goal against the powerful Blue Jays and added an assist against Montreat. Sewanee travels to Transylvania University this weekend to take on both Transy and Maryville (Tenn.).

Southwestern posted a 1-0-1 record during opening weekend as they picked up a 2-1 victory over Pacific Lutheran University on Saturday. Seniors Kyle Strine and Preston Hollis both scored to stake SU to a 2-0 lead. Junior goalie Ryan Tasin stopped six shots for the win. In the next game, the Southwestern faced off against Whitworth University in a battle of schools with Pirate mascots. The two teams played 110 minutes of scoreless soccer to a 0-0 tie. The men will face three American Southwest Conference opponents this week as they host the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor on Tuesday before traveling to Dallas, Texas for a pair of games with Hardin-Simmons University and the University of Texas-Dallas.

No. 1 Trinity opened its season with two home victories over the weekend, defeating Whitworth University 2-1 on Saturday and then downing Pacific Lutheran University 3-1 on Sunday afternoon. The 2-0 start to the season is the ninth consecutive season that the Tiger men have opened up the year with two victories. The wins also put Trinity's regular season unbeaten streak at 21 games, dating back to the final game of the 2005 season. Patrick Floeck, last year's top goal-scorer, led the team with three goals in the two games. Floeck scored on just six total shots. Also scoring were German Gomez – who led the team in points last season – and sophomore Chris Schardon. Schardon's goal was the first in his career. Team captains Tyrone Petrakis and Kyle Altman had two assists each, as did Noe Casanova. Gomez also had one assist for the Tigers. Trinity will hit the road next weekend, taking on UT-Dallas and Hardin-Simmons.
