SCAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Games of September 10 – September 16

NOE CASANOVA OF TRINITY UNIVERSITY, a junior midfielder from Kingwood, Texas, and **NICK JUDAH OF CENTRE COLLEGE**, a senior forward from Louisville, Ky., have been selected the SCAC Men's Soccer Co-Offensive Players-of-the-Week for matches played from Monday, September 10 through Sunday, September 16.

Casanova led the top-ranked Tigers to a pair of important home wins over the weekend, defeating regionally-ranked Methodist and nationally-ranked Washington (Mo.). **Casanova** scored three goals in the two games to lead the team to victory, netting the opening score in both contests. In Saturday's win over 11th-ranked Washington (Mo.), **Casanova** scored the game-winner less than two minutes into the second half of play. For the season, **Casanova** is third on the team with eight total points, tallying three goals – all scored this weekend – and two assists, including Saturday's game-winning goal.

Judah had a brilliant weekend for the Colonels, scoring the game-winning goal in each of the team's two matches. On Friday against Heidelberg, **Judah** created a breakaway off a throw in and converted the only goal of the match at the 18:38 mark. Then on Saturday, he converted a composed finish on another breakaway just 1:40 into the match and paced the offense to a 2-0 victory over regionally-ranked Wittenberg. The goal was **Judah's** team-leading fourth of the season.

Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:

Sophomore forward Andres Colococho of Millsaps recorded the eventual game-winning goal in the 28th minute in a 2-0 win over Huntingdon College along with dishing out a pair of assists in the first half in a 3-0 win over LaGrange College. Colococho is now tied with Aaron Hyatt for the team lead in overall points with five (1 goal, 3 assists). **Junior midfielder Robbie Wynne of Sewanee** scored two of Sewanee's three goals in the Tigers' 3-1 victory over Huntingdon (Ala.) Sunday in Montgomery. His penalty kick put Sewanee ahead 2-0 and then his inside goal iced the victory for the Tigers. **Austin, Colorado College, DePauw, Hendrix, Rhodes and Southwestern** did not nominate anyone for the award, and **Oglethorpe** did not play.

SCAC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

CHRIS CREGER OF CENTRE COLLEGE, a senior goalkeeper from Charleston, S.C., and **JAKE MILNER OF MILLSAPS COLLEGE**, a senior goalkeeper from Flowood, Miss., have been selected the SCAC Men's Soccer Defensive Co-Players-of-the-Week for matches played from Monday, September 10 through Sunday, September 16.

Creger recorded two shutouts and 10 saves in earning two victories for the Colonels as the team improved to 5-1-1. On Saturday night with less than five minutes to play and trailing 1-0, Wittenberg was given a penalty kick. **Creger** rose to the occasion - catching the PK and initiating a counter-attack that the Colonels converted with a goal to seal the victory.

Milner posted the fifth and sixth shutouts of his career in a pair of wins on Friday and Sunday over Huntingdon College (2-0) and LaGrange College (3-0). **Milner** picked up six saves on the weekend to improve to 2-3 between the posts with a .706 save percentage.

Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:

Senior midfielder Thomas Owens of Trinity led a Tiger defense that allowed just five shots on goal in 180 minutes of action over the weekend, including a shutout of 11th-ranked Washington (Mo.) University on Saturday night. Owens and the defense gave up just two total shots on Friday against Methodist, with the goal coming after Trinity had built up a 6-0 lead. On Saturday, the defense allowed just 10 shots to a nationally-ranked team, with only four of those shots being on target. For the season, Owens has led the defense to three shutouts in six games, allowing just one goal in the other three games. Only 17 shots have been on goal against the Tigers all year long. **Senior goalkeeper Dave Kluen of Colorado College** recorded his 15th career shutout and second of the season in Saturday's 5-0 victory over Kalamazoo College. He was also in goal for CC's 2-1 victory over Cal State East Bay on Sunday. He stopped eight of nine shots on the weekend, with the only goal coming on a penalty kick. Khuen lowered his goal-against average to 1.15 and improved his saves percentage to .778. **Austin, DePauw, Hendrix, Rhodes, Sewanee and Southwestern** did not nominate anyone for the award, and **Oglethorpe** did not play.

AROUND THE SCAC

Austin dropped two matches over the weekend, losing 2-1 in overtime to Dallas on Friday and 2-1 to Illinois College on Saturday. After playing to a draw in their season-opener, the 'Roos have dropped four straight. First-year forward Garrett Evans had both goals for Austin over the weekend – the first two goals of his collegiate career. Austin plays three times this week – a home match against UT-Dallas on Tuesday and then the team's first SCAC contest of the 2007 season – a road match at Colorado College on Saturday. While at Colorado College, the 'Roos will play Nebraska Wesleyan on Sunday.

Birmingham-Southern went 0-2 for the week while participating in the UAB Classic on the campus of UAB in Birmingham, Ala. BSC lost 3-0 decision to host UAB on Friday night and then 2-0 to Alabama A&M on Sunday afternoon. Gino Cozzolino and Stefan Haben were named to the UAB Classic All-Tournament. The Panthers host Southwestern University on Friday at 4 p.m. and Trinity University on Sunday at 2 p.m. to open SCAC play.

No. 23 Centre returned to its winning ways over the weekend, posting two shutouts to improve to 5-1-1 on the season. Centre hosted the inaugural Adidas Classic, its second Invitational of the season. On Friday, the Colonels defeated Heidelberg, 1-0, in a lopsided match. Centre out-shot the Student Princes 16-6 and held an 8-2 advantage in corner kicks. Then on Saturday night, the Colonels downed Wittenberg, 2-0. The match was decided with less than five minutes to play when the Tigers were given a penalty kick. Senior goalkeeper Chris Creger made a huge save on the PK, which in turn incited a quick transition goal from senior Matt Corbett that sealed the win for the Colonels. Centre begins conference play next week traveling south to take on Hendrix and Rhodes.

Colorado College won twice over the weekend, defeating Kalamazoo, 5-0, on Saturday and Cal State East Bay, 2-1, on Sunday. The Tigers have outscored their opponents 16-2 while winning three consecutive games. Sophomore forward David Van Sicklen's first career goal turned out to be a game-winner in Sunday's victory over Cal State East Bay. Sophomore forward Trevor Cobb is on a three-game point streak and a two-game goal streak. Senior midfielder Pat Fagan is on a three-game assist streak. Colorado College plays host to Nebraska Wesleyan on Friday before playing its first-ever SCAC match against Austin College on Saturday.

No. 21 DePauw suffered its first loss of the 2007 season, a 3-0 defeat at 18th-ranked Ohio Wesleyan on Friday. It was the Tigers first time to be shutout since Oct. 20, 2006 at Southwestern – a streak of eight matches. In Friday's match, each team totaled 14 shots, while Ohio Wesleyan held a 4-1 advantage in corners. DePauw opens Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference play next Friday at Rhodes.

Hendrix played only one game this past week, a mid-week road game at Williams Baptist College. The Warriors' attack started early, scoring in the first two minutes of the game. Senior Alex Ragula and Nick Forsten had two goals each in the Warriors' 4-0 shutout of the Eagles. Hendrix will open SCAC play this weekend as they host Centre on Friday and DePauw on Sunday. The Warriors are 0-9 against DePauw since the Tigers entered the SCAC in 1998. Hendrix last defeated Centre in 2001 – a 3-2 overtime decision in Conway.

Millsaps picked up its first two wins of the 2007 season this weekend. The Majors outplayed Huntingdon College on Friday for a 2-0 win and followed that up with an impressive 3-0 shutout win over LaGrange on Sunday – both on the road. Jake Milner posted the fifth and sixth shutouts of his career, picking up six saves to

improve to 2-3 between the posts with a .706 save percentage. **Millsaps'** Andres Colocho recorded the eventual game-winning goal in the 28th minute in Friday's win along with dishing out a pair of assists in the first half in Sunday's win. The Majors will have their work cut out for them this weekend, playing host to the nation's top-ranked team and SCAC foe Trinity (6-0-0) in Friday's conference-opener before a meeting with Southwestern (4-3-1) on Sunday.

Oglethorpe was off last week. The Petrels travel to Maryville (Tenn.) College on Monday before returning to Atlanta to host regionally-ranked Emory University on Sunday. OU has lost 13 straight to Emory (dating to 1994) and has been outscored 61-9 over that span.

Rhodes dropped to 1-3-0 on the season, losing to cross-town rival Christian Brothers, 2-0, on Wednesday. The Lynx had a match scheduled against Fisk on Sunday that was cancelled by the visiting Bulldogs. Rhodes opens SCAC play this weekend with home matches against DePauw (Friday) and Centre (Sunday). The Lynx have gone 0-4 against the two over the last two seasons. Due to a scheduling quirk created from recent conference expansion, this will be the third straight year that Rhodes has hosted the duo.

Sewanee won its only match of the week – a 3-1 road decision over Huntingdon. Tab Wood scored a first half goal on a header off of a corner kick for Sewanee, taking the Tigers into the halftime break with a 1-0 lead. A pair of Robbie Wynne goals in the second secured the final score in favor of the Tigers. His first was on a penalty kick and the second of Wynne's goals was off of a Jackson Gannaway assist. It was the third multi-goal game of Wynne's career. Sewanee travels to play perennial power Emory University on Friday before returning for a home match against Fisk on Sunday.

Southwestern posted a 1-2 record during the past week. In the first game of the week at UT-Tyler, SU was shut out in a 1-0 loss, allowing the one goal on just two shots on goal. Later in the week, on Friday in San Antonio, the Pirates faced off against #11 Washington (Mo.) University. The Pirates kept things tied through the first period but faltered in the second half of a 3-0 loss. The next day, Methodist University came to Georgetown, to face the Pirates. SU broke a three game scoreless streak with goals from Ben Hoffman and John Yi for the 2-0 win. Southwestern opens the SCAC portion of its schedule this weekend with matches against Birmingham-Southern and Millsaps.

No. 1 Trinity won a pair of home games against regionally and nationally-ranked competition over the weekend. Trinity beat regionally-ranked Methodist University 6-1 on Friday night, then handed Washington (Mo.) University – the No. 11 team in the nation – a 1-0 defeat on Saturday night. In Friday's game, Trinity's offense was relentless, scoring three times in each period. Patrick Floeck scored his first career hat trick to lead the team – including the eventual game-winner in the 11th minute. Noe Casanova also scored a pair of goals, which included the game's opening goal in the third minute. On Saturday, against 11th-ranked Washington, the Tiger offense out-shot the visitors 14-4 but couldn't manage a score in the opening period. Casanova changed that just 1:23 into the second period, netting his third goal of the weekend on an assist from Tyrone Petrakis. David Steinberg secured the team's third shutout of the season – including his first solo shutout of the year – with four saves in the game, three of which came in the second half. Trinity opens SCAC play this weekend on the road against Millsaps and Birmingham-Southern. The Tigers are 16-0 against Millsaps since 1991, and have never faced newest SCAC team Birmingham-Southern.
