SCAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Games of October 15 – October 21

TYRONE PETRAKIS OF TRINITY UNIVERSITY, a junior midfielder from Albuquerque, N.M., and **KYLE STRINE OF SOUTHWESTERN UNIVERSITY**, a senior midfielder from Houston, Texas, have been selected the SCAC Men's Soccer Offensive Co-Players-of-the-Week for matches played from Monday, October 15 through Sunday, October 21.

Petrakis led the Tigers to a pair of shutout wins in SCAC play this weekend against two nationally-ranked teams. He scored three goals overall in the two games, including a two-goal game on Friday against #23 DePauw. **Petrakis'** first goal of the weekend was the game-winner in the 21st minute, while his second goal gave him his sixth career multi-goal game – his second of the 2007 season. Against #10 Centre, he added an insurance goal just over five minutes after the first score, effectively putting the game out of reach. For the season, **Petrakis** is third on the team with eight goals and 21 points this season, and is tied for the team lead with three game-winning goals.

Strine scored both goals for Southwestern in Friday's upset of 10th-ranked Centre, 2-1. He put the Pirates ahead 1-0 during the 30th minute with an assist from Scott Smith and with less than six minutes remaining in the game, he redirected a cross from Nathan Shaw-Meadow into the net for the game-winner. For the season, **Strine** has six goals and three assists for 15 points - currently third on the team.

Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:

Senior defender Nate Spradlin of Austin College made his senior day a memorable one, scoring in the 82nd minute to give the 'Roos their first win of the season - a 2-1 come-from-behind victory over the Petrels of Oglethorpe. He also had the team's lone goal - a penalty kick - in Friday's 2-1 loss to Sewanee. Sophomore forward Logan Eberly of Rhodes scored two goals over the weekend as the Lynx won twice in as many days. His first goal was an insurance goal in Friday's 2-0 SCAC win over Hendrix. His second was the game-winner in Saturday's come-from-behind 2-1 win at Central Baptist College. Centre, Colorado College, DePauw, Hendrix, Oglethorpe and Sewanee did not nominate anyone for the award, and Millsaps did not play.

SCAC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

MICHAEL ROBERTSON OF TRINITY UNIVERSITY, a junior defender from San Antonio, Texas, have been selected the SCAC Men's Soccer Defensive Player-of-the-Week for matches played from Monday, October 15 through Sunday, October 21.

Robertson was part of a defense that gave a dominating performance last weekend, shutting out a pair of nationally-ranked teams en route to setting a new SCAC record. **Robertson** and the Tiger backs gave up no goals on just 12 total shots against No. 23 DePauw and No. 10 Centre – both of which came into the game among the league leaders offensively. DePauw was second in the SCAC with 3.0 goals and over 17 shots per game coming into the weekend, but managed just seven shots against these four defenders. Centre was averaging over 16 shots and 2.6 goals per game, but was held to just five total shots in the shutout loss. **Robertson** has started on the back row in every game this season, which includes seven shutouts in league play. The Tigers have recorded six consecutive SCAC shutouts, which breaks the conference record tied by Trinity in 2004-2005 and set by Southwestern during the 2001 season.

Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:

Junior goalkeeper Ryan Tasin of Southwestern had a solid week in net as the Pirates defeated two ranked SCAC opponents. In Friday's 2-1 win against 10th-ranked Centre, Tasin stopped five shots as well as denying many opportunities on balls crossed into the box by stepping up and making grabs. Then, against 23rd-ranked DePauw, he had to make just two saves in earning his fifth shutout of the season. The Southwestern defense has now allowed just two goals in seven SCAC games. Senior goalkeeper Dave Khuen of Colorado College recorded his 30th career victory when the Tigers defeated Oglethorpe, 1-0, on Friday. Khuen earned his 20th career shutout and his seventh of the season with Sunday's 3-0 win over Sewanee. With the two victories, Khuen improved to 9-3-0 overall this season and lowered his goals-against-average to a career-best 0.74. Junior goalkeeper Alex Margolin of Rhodes made five saves to help the Lynx to a 2-0 victory over Hendrix Friday night. It was his second SCAC shutout of the season. Margolin made three saves on Sunday as they Lynx defeated Central Baptist College, 2-1. Senior defender Ryan Bielefeldt of Austin College controlled the back of the 'Roo defense and helped limit Oglethorpe to just five second-half shots en route to a 2-1 victory on Sunday - the team's first win of the season. Centre, DePauw, Hendrix, Oglethorpe and Sewanee did not nominate anyone for the award, and Millsaps did not play.

AROUND THE SCAC

After its losing streak extended to 12 games with a 2-1 loss to Sewanee on Friday, **Austin College** picked up its first win since October 22, 2006 with a 2-1 victory over Oglethorpe. The 'Roos fell behind 1-0 to OU on Sunday, but got the equalizer from Tommy Haney at 71:47 and then Nathan Spradlin, on an assist from John Martinez with less than seven minutes remaining in regulation, found the back of the net on what proved to be the game-winner. Austin out-shot OU 34-12. Spradlin had the 'Roos only goal off a penalty kick in Friday's loss to Sewanee.

Birmingham-Southern went 1-1 in a pair of games against non-conference foes in St. Louis, Mo., this week. BSC lost a 1-0 decision to No. 19 Washington University on Friday but rebounded on Sunday to earn a 2-0 win over Fontbonne. Norman Baer scored a goal in the 60th minute and assisted on BSC's first goal, feeding Gino Cozzolino in the 12th minute. The Panthers are now 6-8-0 on the season and will host its final two home games of the season against Hendrix College on Friday at 8 p.m. and Rhodes College on Sunday at 2 p.m. at the BSC Soccer Park.

No. 25 Centre dropped a pair of games on the road over the weekend in SCAC play. On Friday, Southwestern snapped the Colonel's nine-game winning streak by defeating Centre 2-1. Then on Sunday, #1 Trinity handed Centre its second straight loss defeating the Colonels 2-0. The weekend drops Centre's record to 12-3-1 and 5-2 in SCAC play. Centre will now take on Colorado and Austin for their homecoming weekend.

Colorado College posted its second and third consecutive shutouts this weekend with victories over Oglethorpe on Friday (1-0) and Sewanee on Sunday (3-0). The CC defense has allowed only four goals in six conference matches. The victory over Oglethorpe was the 12th time this season the Tiger defense has limited its opponents to five or fewer shots on goal. Junior forward Chris Quon recorded his first career game-winning goal when he scored 1:21 into Sunday's match against Sewanee. Junior forward Logan Bocard had a goal and an assist against Sewanee to move into a tie with Trevor Cobb for the team lead in goals (6) and points (16). Colorado College completed its home schedule with a 10-4 record, outscoring its opponents 34-13. The Tigers will play their final four regular season games on the road, beginning next Friday at Centre College.

DePauw had a tough trip to Texas, dropping matches to top-ranked Trinity, 3-0, and to Southwestern, 2-0 – the team's first conference losses of the season. The last time DePauw had been blanked in a SCAC weekend was also on the TU/SU trip in 2004. The Indiana Tigers faced a barrage of shots on the weekend. Trinity outshot DePauw, 39-7 and held a 12-0 advantage in corners on Friday and Southwestern outshot the Tigers, 17-2 and held a 7-3 advantage in corners on Sunday. DePauw's John Fenley recorded six save on Friday and eight more on Sunday. DePauw returns home to host Austin College and Colorado College this weekend.

Hendrix lost a 2-0 contest under the lights against Rhodes College Friday night at Warriors Field – the team's only match of the week. The game remained scoreless until the 42nd minute when Rhodes senior Chase LaFont put the ball into the back of the net off an assist from junior Patrick Deveau. Sophomore Logan Eberly scored the Lynx's final point in the 52nd minute of play off an assist from first year Brett Simek. Hendrix seniors Nick Forsten and Alex Ragula led the team with three shots and one shot-on-goal each. Rhodes notched a 15-11 advantage in shots, including a 6-3 lead in corner kicks.

Millsaps will resume competition this weekend at home after an idle weekend due to Fall Break. The Majors (3-10, 1-5 SCAC) will recognize seniors Jake Milner and

AROUND THE SCAC

Heath Smith and play their final two home games of the season on Homecoming weekend before concluding the 2007 schedule on the road at Sewanee and Oglethorpe on Nov. 2 and 4. **Millsaps** is 1-4 on the year at Harper Davis Field and looks to snap a 4-match losing streak.

Oglethorpe dropped its third and fourth straight games, losing to Colorado College, 1-0, and to Austin College, 2-1. The Petrels were out-shot 24-6 by the Colorado Tigers on Friday. Michael Hadjisimos had six saves in net for OU. Jonathan McConnell got the Petrels on the board first against Austin College, but the "Roos responded with two unanswered goals to take the victory. Hadjisimos had eight more saves in the contest as Austin out-shot Oglethorpe, 34-12. At 3-10-0, OU has suffered double-digits losses for the first time since 2003.

Rhodes picked up a couple of wins on the weekend, defeating Hendrix, 2-0, in SCAC play on Friday followed by a 2-1 non-conference victory over Central Baptist College a day later. Chase LaFont – off a corner kick from Patrick Deveau – scored the game-winner against the Warriors. Logan Eberly added a goal on an assist from Brett Simek. Alex Margolin notched his second shutout of the season. The Lynx won their second game of the weekend and third straight on Saturday. Eric DeVore had a goal and an assist and Eberly had the game-winning goal in the 62nd minute. Eberly's goal is his team-leading seventh of the season.

Sewanee split its two matches on the road this past weekend, defeating Austin College, 2-1, on Friday before falling to Colorado College, 3-0, on Sunday. After falling behind 1-0 on Friday, Corbin Dixon, off an assist from Robbie Wynne, tied the game in the 68th minute and two minutes later, Wynne found the net on what proved to be the game-winner. The Tennessee Tigers were out-shot 28-12 by Colorado College on Sunday and suffered its fifth goalless game of the season. Sewanee plays host to top-ranked Trinity on Friday and regionally-ranked Southwestern on Sunday.

Southwestern defeated a pair of ranked SCAC teams this past weekend to take sole possession of second in the conference. On Friday, the Pirates handed #10 Centre a 2-1 setback Senior Kyle Strine scored both goals, including the game-winner during the 84th minute. Then on Sunday SU hosted #23 DePauw and shutout the Tigers 2-0. The Pirates allowed just two shots and got goals from Josh Spencer and David Lozano. The Pirates now own a 5-1-1 SCAC record and are five points behind first place Trinity. Southwestern heads out on the road for the upcoming weekend when they travel to Atlanta, Ga., to face Oglethorpe and then on to Sewanee, Tenn., to take on Sewanee.

No. 1 Trinity posted a pair of SCAC shutouts against nationally-ranked teams over the weekend, beating DePauw and Centre by a combined score of 5-0 in the two games. The Tigers have now recorded six consecutive SCAC shutouts, establishing a new men's soccer record in the conference. Top-ranked Trinity opened the weekend with a 3-0 win over No. 23 DePauw, improving to 10-3 in that series. NSCAA All-American Tyrone Petrakis scored a pair of goals – including the game-winner – to lead the team to victory. Ben Stewart also recorded two assists to give him 31 in his career, moving into third place all-time. On Sunday, the Tigers were up to the task again, this time against 10th-ranked Centre College. Petrakis added another goal in this one, but it was Cameron Hogsett who scored the eventual game-winner in the 32nd minute. Defensively, Trinity put forth one its best efforts in recent memory. The Tigers gave up just five shots and no goals to Centre, after allowing no goals and seven shots to DePauw on Sunday. Trinity travels to Sewanee and Oglethorpe this weekend. The Tigers are a combined 31-1 against the two teams, with the only blemish coming in a non-conference game in 1992.
