SCAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Games of October 22 – October 28

JOSEPH DECOSTA OF TRINITY UNIVERSITY, a sophomore midfielder from Dallas, Texas, have been selected the SCAC Men's Soccer Offensive Player-of-the-Week for matches played from Monday, October 22 through Sunday, October 28.

DeCosta scored four goals to lead Trinity to a pair of SCAC wins over the weekend, clinching the team's sixth consecutive SCAC Championship in the process. **DeCosta** nailed a hat trick in the weekend finale at Oglethorpe – his first career start. He hit four total goals on just seven shots in the two games. The hat trick was the third of the season for the Tigers – by three different players. For the season, **DeCosta** has 11 points this season, scoring four total goals – all coming this weekend – and three assists.

Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:

Senior midfielder Daniel Webb of Southwestern had his best weekend of the season as he scored a pair of game-winners in SCAC action to keep SU in second place in the conference. On Friday at Oglethorpe, Webb scored the Pirates' first two goals in a 3-0 victory. Both goals were unassisted during the 60th and 68th minutes. Then, on Sunday at Sewanee, he scored his third unassisted goal of the weekend at the 85:14 mark to break a 1-1 tie and give Southwestern the win. Junior forward/midfielder Mike Harris of DePauw scored the game-winning goal with 6:47 remaining in regulation in Friday's 2-1 win over Austin College. He had the game's only goal in Sunday's 1-0 victory over Colorado College. Sophomore forward Andres Colocho of Millsaps picked up five points off a pair of goals - his second and third of the season - and an assist to help lead the Majors to a 3-2 win over the visitors from Hendrix on Sunday. His first goal in the 44th minute knotted the game at 1-1 while his assist to teammate Todd Schneck in the 75th minute off a perfect cross proved to be the eventual game-winner. Senior outside midfielder Robby Crump of Centre scored the game-winning goal and gave the Colonels the 3-2 overtime victory over Austin College. Just over five minutes into the overtime period, Crump hit the game-winner on a diving header. The goal was the first in the senior's career and could not have created at a more magical moment – coming on the night that both Austin and Centre donated over \$5,300 in the names of Sue Hauck, Crump's mother, and Elizabeth Walter to the Susan G. Komen Foundation. Junior forward Logan Bocard of Colorado College scored a pair of goals, including his team-leading third game-winning goal of the season, as the Tigers extended their winning streak to four matches with a 3-0 victory at 25th-ranked Centre on Friday. It was Bocard's second two-goal game of the season and his sixth multi-point game. Junior midfielder Patrick Deveau of Rhodes stepped up his game as he scored a goal and assisted on another in Friday's 3-2 overtime win against Millsaps. Deveau led the team in shots this weekend with seven and continues to direct and lead the Lynx from his central midfield position. Senior forward Alex Ragula of Hendrix scored his fourth goal of the season on Sunday off an assist from Sam Freyaldenhoven as the Warriors dropped a tough 3-2 road decision at Millsaps. Austin College, Oglethorpe and Sewanee did not nominate anyone for the award.

SCAC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

KEVIN O'NEIL OF SOUTHWESTERN UNIVERSITY, a junior defender from San Antonio, Texas, has been selected the SCAC Men's Soccer Defensive Player-of-the-Week for matches played from Monday, October 22 through Sunday, October 28.

O'Neil continued his stellar play this past weekend as he helped anchor the SU defense to two more SCAC wins. The Pirates shutout the Stormy Petrels on Friday with a strong effort that saw SU allow just two different players to even attempt shots. Then, on Sunday, O'Neil and the Southwestern defense allowed just four shots on goal by Sewanee.

Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:

Senior defender Nick Dascoli of DePauw led the Tigers' defensive effort which allowed just one goal in a weekend conference sweep. Senior goalkeeper David Steinberg of Trinity led the team to two SCAC road wins last weekend, securing the team's sixth straight – and 11th overall – SCAC title. Steinberg gave up just one goal in over 125 minutes of action, recording two saves out of just four shots on goal allowed by Trinity. Senior goalkeeper Dave Khuen of Colorado College recorded his 21st career shutout and his eighth of the season with the victory at Centre. Despite allowing a goal for the first time in five games against DePauw on Sunday, Khuen's goals-against average dropped to a personal single-season best 0.70. Junior defender Jessee Cavett of Rhodes had a solid weekend performance defensively and joined in the attack to score the game-winner in overtime against Millsaps on Friday night. Junior sweeper Adam Boyer of Centre led the 25th-ranked Colonel defense to a 1-1 record over the weekend. After dropping a 3-0 loss to Colorado on Friday, Boyer and the Colonels bounced back to defeat Austin 3-2 in overtime. Boyer kept and organized and composed defense that allowed just six shots and two corner kicks on the night. Sophomore defender Brandon Mong of Millsaps, in addition to his strong weekend on the backline of the Majors' defense, netted his team-leading fourth goal of the year to break open a scoreless game in the 20th minute in a tough 3-2, double overtime loss to Rhodes on Friday. Mong lined up a direct kick from 40-yards out that sailed into the box. Austin College, Hendrix, Oglethorpe and Sewanee did not nominate anyone for the award.

AROUND THE SCAC

Austin College lost a couple of tough one-goal road matches, falling 2-1 to DePauw on Friday and 3-2 in overtime to #25 Centre on Saturday. Nathan Spradlin had the equalizer against DePauw on Friday, but the Tigers scored the game-winner with less than seven minutes remaining. Matt Dickinson had eight saves in net for Austin. On Saturday against Centre, Austin Newman got the 'Roos on the board first and after falling behind 2-1, Garrett Evans tied it with three minutes to go in regulation. Nate Noel went the distance for the 'Roos in net and had four saves. Austin closes out the 2007 regular season with a road trip to Rhodes and Hendrix.

Birmingham-Southern men's soccer posted a 2-0 week and has now won three straight games to move to 9-8-0 on the season. The Panthers defeated Hendrix College, 3-0, on Friday and Rhodes College, 2-1, on Sunday. After a scoreless first half, the Panthers' Robert Geil, Gino Cozzolino (penalty kick) and Norman Baer scored second half goals in the 3-0 win over Hendrix. Against Rhodes, Baer scored the game-winner with 2:03 left in the game to break the 1-1 tie and give BSC the 2-1 win. Rhodes took a 1-0 lead in the first half before Denis Brunotte tied the game in the 31st minute. BSC hits the road this week, traveling to Oglethorpe on Friday at 1:30 p.m. and Sewanee on Sunday at 2 p.m.

Centre went 1-1 on the weekend losing to Colorado College 3-0 on Friday before defeating Austin College 3-2 in overtime on Saturday night. On Friday against Colorado, the Tigers capitalized on their opportunities and Centre never found a rhythm costing them a 3-0 defeat. On Saturday, in a philanthropic competition between Centre and Austin, \$5,300 was donated in the name of Sue Hauck and Elizabeth Walter to the Susan G. Komen Foundation. With the score tied at 2 and just over five minutes into the first overtime period, Robby Crump, whose mother Sue Hauck passed away earlier this fall from breast cancer, hit the game-winner on a diving header. The goal was the first in the senior's career. With the victory, Centre broke a three-game losing streak and improved to 13-4-1 on the season. Centre is on the road again next weekend, traveling to Indiana to take on DePauw in Page Cotton's career finale.

Colorado College posted a 3-0 victory over th-ranked Centre on Friday as goalkeeper Dave Khuen recorded his 21st career shutout and his eighth of the season. His eight saves are the most he has made in a shutout this season. Logan Boccard scored a pair of goals, including his team-leading third game-winning goal of the season. The Tigers are 6-0 when Boccard scores a goal and 9-0 when he has a point. Khuen allowed his first goal in five games in the 1-0 loss to DePauw on Sunday. The Tigers will play their final two regular season games on the road at Hendrix and Rhodes.

DePauw will play its final regular season game under 38-year head coach Page Cotton this weekend when the Tigers welcome Centre to Greencastle for the 2007 regular season finale for both squads. Cotton, who has a lifetime mark of 390-189-33, is currently ninth among active coaches in career wins. DePauw added two wins for Cotton this past weekend, defeating Austin College, 2-1, on Friday and Colorado College, 1-0, on Sunday. The meeting on Sunday involved another coach ranked in the top 10 among active head coaches as CC's Horst Richardson has 481 career wins – fourth on the all-time list. Jeremy Rielley had his team-leading 12th goal of the season on Friday. Both he and Mike Harris had a goal and an assist for the weekend.

Hendrix men's soccer team competed in two matches this past week – a 3-0 loss against Birmingham Southern College Friday night at BSC Soccer Park in Birmingham, Ala. and a 3-2 to defeat to Millsaps College on Sunday afternoon in Jackson, Miss. Hendrix showed improvement in its second loss of the week, as the team had not put any points on the board since a 3-1 loss to DePauw University on Sept. 23. The Warriors also tied their third-highest shots on goal total with eight in the match. Senior Alex Ragula scored his fourth goal of the season on Sunday off an assist from senior Sam Freyaldenhoven.

AROUND THE SCAC

Millsaps closed out its 2007 home slate with a conference split during Homecoming weekend, falling to Rhodes Friday night in a 3-2, double overtime thriller before bouncing back Sunday to earn a 3-2 win over Hendrix for its second league win of the year – the first time since 1999. Sophomore Andres Colocho paced the Millsaps offense, netting a pair of goals and adding the game-winning assist to Todd Schneck in Sunday's match while Heath Smith, Phil Guillot, Luke Campbell and Brandon Mong combined for a strong defensive performance on the backline. The Majors wrap up the regular season at Sewanee and Oglethorpe this weekend.

Oglethorpe dropped its fifth and sixth straight contests this weekend, losing to Southwestern (3-0) and to Trinity (6-1). The Petrels finish up the 2007 season at home this weekend and play host to Birmingham-Southern on Friday and to Millsaps on Sunday. Bryan Burnick, on an assist from Matthew Chugdon, provided OU its only goal of the weekend. It was his third goal of the season. The Petrels were out-shot 53-15 on the weekend. OU's six-match losing streak is the longest the program has suffered since a six-game skid late in the 2001 season.

Rhodes splits its two conference matches this past weekend, defeating Millsaps, 3-2, in double overtime before dropping a 2-1 decision to Birmingham-Southern on Sunday. Rhodes has now won 15 straight against Millsaps, but Friday's win did not come easy. The Lynx trailed 2-1, but Joey Medere put in the equalizer with 15 minutes to play in regulation. Jessee Cavett, on an assist from Bret Simek, beat the keeper with a ball in the far right corner in the second overtime for the game-winner. Chris Chugden gave Rhodes an early 1-0 lead against Birmingham-Southern, but the Panthers scored two unanswered to thwart the Lynx. Alex Mathis, who went the distance in net in both games, had eight saves against BSC. Rhodes ends its 2007 season with home matches against Austin College and Colorado College.

Sewanee was defeated twice at home last weekend, losing to #1 Trinity 5-1 on Friday and to Southwestern 2-1 on Sunday. Sewanee, who has lost all 17 of its matches against Trinity in the SCAC era, trailed the Tigers 4-0 at the half and never recovered. Robbie Wynne had his team-high ninth goal of the season in the loss. Tab Wood, on an assist from Wynne, evened the match on Sunday against Southwestern at 1 midway through the second half, but the Pirates scored with less than five minutes to play to earn the victory. Sewanee was out-shot 53-15 combined in the two matches. Sewanee closes out the 2007 season with a pair of home conference matches against Millsaps and Birmingham-Southern.

Southwestern ran its record over the last 10 games to 8-1-1 with two more wins this past weekend. The Pirates earned a 3-0 win over SCAC foe Oglethorpe on Friday with a pair of goals from Daniel Webb and one from Josh Spencer. Two days later, sophomore Nathan Shaw-Meadow scored his first career goal and late in the game Webb scored the game winner as SU pulled out the 2-1 win. Webb scored three of his four goals this season during the week and had both game-winners. The Pirates sit alone in second place of the SCAC with 22 points, SU's highest point total ever in the conference standings. SU heads down the road to San Antonio to take on #1 Trinity to close out the regular season on Friday.

No. 1 Trinity wrapped up the SCAC Championship last weekend, defeating both Sewanee and Oglethorpe on the road on Friday and Sunday. The Tigers beat Sewanee 5-1 on Friday, then handed Oglethorpe a 6-1 loss to put the conference title out of reach. Trinity is 9-0-0 this season, totaling 27 SCAC points. Second place Southwestern has 22 points with a 7-1-1 record. The SCAC Championship is the 11th overall title for the Trinity Tigers, and the sixth consecutive. Trinity has now won 18 consecutive games in the SCAC, dating back to the 2006 season. Joseph DeCosta scored four goals over the weekend, including a hat trick on Sunday afternoon against Oglethorpe. The game marked the first start of the season for DeCosta. Leading scorer Patrick Floeck nailed three goals in two games, while Ben Stewart had three assists. Kyle Altman also added a pair of assists over the weekend. Trinity will host Southwestern in the regular season finale on Friday night, holding a 16-0-3 against the Pirates since 1993. Last year's game in Georgetown was a 1-0 win by Trinity, while the last time Southwestern played a SCAC game in San Antonio, the Pirates forced a 2-2 tie – the only blemish of the 2005 season on the Tigers' record.
