SCAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Games of October 1 – October 7

MICHELLE GRAMBEAU OF TRINITY UNIVERSITY, a sophomore midfielder from Ann Arbor, Mich., has been selected the SCAC Women's Soccer Offensive Player-of-the-Week for matches played from Monday, October 1 through Sunday, October 7.

Grambeau scored three goals last weekend to lead Trinity to a pair of SCAC wins at home over Hendrix and Rhodes. She scored once in a 6-0 win over Hendrix on Friday night, then added two goals in a key win over regionally-ranked Rhodes on Sunday. Against Rhodes, **Grambeau** recorded the first score of the game in 13th minute, and after the Lynx scored twice in the second half to force overtime, **Grambeau** was able to find the back of the net again with just 18 seconds remaining in the second overtime to win it for the Tigers. For the season, **Grambeau** is tied for second on the team with 15 points. She has scored four goals this year – three of which came this weekend. **Grambeau** is also tied for the team lead in assists with seven, and Sunday's game-winner was her first of the season.

Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:

Sophomore midfielder Allison Davis of Sewanee scored two goals in the Tigers' 8-1 win over SCAC opponent Oglethorpe on Saturday. On Sunday, Davis scored two more in Sewanee's 11-0 route of Piedmont, taking her weekend total to four goals. Davis has seven goals and two assists to lead the Tiger scoring in 2007. Junior forward Allison Terry of Centre had a prolific weekend for the Colonels, accumulating seven points in two games. Friday night against Millsaps College, Terry scored two goals and assisted on two others. She helped to lift the Colonels to victory over Birmingham Southern on Sunday afternoon, assisting on the only goal of the game. To date, Terry has 14 points for the season. Sophomore midfielder A.J. Andreola of Southwestern added a pair of goals in the Pirates' 3-1 win over Hendrix on Sunday. She got SU on the board at the 2:31 mark with a goal off the right post and her second goal came during the 85th minute on a pass through the box to beat the goalie for a two-goal lead. Andreola now leads the conference with nine goals and is second in points with 21. First-year forward Stephanie Patton of DePauw had a goal and an assist in Friday's 3-2 loss to Birmingham-Southern. Austin, Hendrix, Millsaps, Oglethorpe and Rhodes did not nominate anyone for the award.

SCAC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

KATE ANDERSON OF CENTRE COLLEGE, a junior defender from Louisville, Ky., has been selected the SCAC Women's Soccer Defensive Player-of-the-Week for matches played from Monday, October 1 through Sunday, October 7.

Anderson earned her first assist of the year Friday night against Millsaps, which came on the game-winning goal by Allison Terry. More impressively, **Anderson's** leadership in the back prevented Millsaps from taking any shots in the game. On Sunday, **Anderson** once again helped prevent any goals from being scored - this time by Birmingham-Southern's attack. On the year, **Anderson** has helped to solidify the Colonels' defense and elevate the team's play. To date, Centre has allowed only six goals in over 1000 minutes of play, posting a goals-against average of 0.50 with seven shutouts.

Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:

First-year midfielder Lauren Kjolhede of Southwestern helped SU to a 2-0 week in SCAC play with wins over Rhodes and Hendrix. In the Rhodes game, she helped the Pirate back line hold the Lynx to one goal on 11 shots. The first-year also scored her first career goal during the 70th minute on a free kick that went in to the bottom right corner to give the Pirates the 2-1 victory. On Sunday, Kjolhede and the Pirate defense held the Warriors to only three shots. First-year midfielder Tory Thomas of Sewanee moved back to sweeper this weekend and held up the Tiger defense as the Sewanee back line allowed just one goal in two games. Sewanee came up big over the weekend, defeating Oglethorpe, 8-1, on Saturday and then Piedmont, 11-0, on Sunday. Thomas scored her first collegiate goal on Sunday from her sweeper position. Senior goalkeeper Jennifer Fifield of Trinity did not allow a goal in over 144 minutes in net over the weekend, leading Trinity to SCAC wins over Hendrix and Rhodes. On Friday, Fifield recorded one save and didn't allow a goal in the first half of a shutout over Hendrix. On Sunday, she played the first 80 minutes of the game, recording four saves in regulation before coming out with the Tigers leading 2-0. After Rhodes forced overtime, Fifield came back in the game, recorded one save and kept the visiting Lynx from stealing a win or a tie. She played over 99 minutes in the game without allowing a goal. For the season, Fifield has allowed just seven goals in 848 minutes in net, posting an impressive 0.74 GAA. She has recorded 28 saves in 11 games played, and has helped the team to four shutouts this season. Junior defender Lindsay Lund of DePauw had a goal and an assist against Millsaps on Sunday and helped the defense to a shutout of the Majors. DePauw out-shot Millsaps, 26-6. Austin, Hendrix, Millsaps, Oglethorpe and Rhodes did not nominate anyone for the award.

AROUND THE SCAC

Austin College posted its fifth shutout of the season, blanking University of Dallas on Saturday, 5-0. Helen Heres and Annie Gunter both had one goal and one assist to pace the 'Roos, who out-shot Dallas 39-2. Austin plays host to Southwestern and Trinity as SCAC play picks back up this weekend. In its inaugural season in the conference, the 'Roos were blanked, 5-0, by Trinity but shutout Southwestern, 1-0, a year ago.

Birmingham-Southern split this weekend on the road, defeating DePauw University, 3-2, Friday, but losing to Centre College, 1-0, Sunday. Senior Caitlin Gordon, who had two goals and an assist against DePauw, continues to lead the team with five goals and eight assists for 18 points. Birmingham-Southern plays at Millsaps on Saturday and then finishes the week against NAIA opponent Auburn University-Montgomery on Sunday.

Centre earned a pair of wins this weekend during conference play against Millsaps and Birmingham Southern. Friday night the Colonels shut-out the Majors in an 8-0 victory. Allison Terry had two goals and two assists and Erin Menard had two goals against Millsaps. Sunday afternoon the Colonel's battled a very strong and aggressive Birmingham-Southern team. For much of the match, the Colonels and Panthers went back and forth, but BSC finally conceded a goal in the 64th minute when Terry hit the cross bar and teammate Cindy Bergstrom played the deflection into the net. With the two wins, Centre earned its sixth and seventh shut-outs of the season. This weekend, the Colonels will travel to Sewanee and Oglethorpe for more conference play.

DePauw lost twice – once out of conference to Calvin and 3-2 to Birmingham-Southern on Friday – before rebounding with a 7-0 shutout of Millsaps. First-year forward Stephanie Patton had a goal and an assist against BSC and added an assist against Millsaps. Junior midfielder Kristin Ellis had two goals against the Majors – the first two-goal game of her career. With nine losses, DePauw has already equaled its season-high in losses since joining the SCAC in 1998. That inaugural '98 squad went 9-9-1, but was 6-1-1 in league play. The Tigers play at Oglethorpe and at Sewanee this weekend. DePauw has defeated OU every year since joining the conference (9-0-0) and has outscored the Petrels 36-0. DePauw is 8-1-0 against Sewanee over that same stretch, but three of the last five matches have gone to overtime.

Hendrix traveled to Texas for a weekend in conference competition with Trinity on Friday and Southwestern on Sunday. The Warriors got off to a slow start on the weekend with a loss to the Tigers 6-0. Hendrix goalkeeper Melissa Taylor had 15 saves in the game. On Sunday, the Warriors hoped to bounce back against the Pirates of Southwestern, but fell 3-1 in a hard fought battle. Hendrix gave up two goals in the first half, but sophomore Caitlin McGeehan answered back with a goal of her own to cut the margin to one. However, in the second half, Southwestern scored a late goal to ice the game. Taylor had 10 more saves on Sunday, giving her 62 for the season. Next up for the Warriors is a home match on October 20th against Rhodes.

Millsaps lost a pair of games on the road to Centre and DePauw this past weekend for its fifth loss in six games, falling to the Colonels 8-0 on Friday where the Majors were held without a shot and 7-0 to the Tigers on Sunday to close the weekend. Sophomore Leslie Robichaux managed five of the Majors' six shots on the road trip, while keepers Rosie McAuley, Jenny Young, Brooke Shipley, Adrenna Jones and Lauren Palfrey combined to shutout Millsaps. The Majors will try and get back in the win column on Saturday, hosting Birmingham-Southern at noon to open a four-game homestand.

AROUND THE SCAC

Oglethorpe remained winless on the 2007 season, losing 8-1 to Sewanee on Saturday. The Petrels have lost eight straight dating to last season – the program's longest winless streak since a 0-8-1 run late in the 2003 season. Since joining the SCAC in 1991, OU has never lost nine straight matches. To avoid equaling that mark, the Petrels will need a win over North Georgia College in non-conference action on Tuesday. Oglethorpe returns home for conference play this weekend with matches against DePauw (Friday) and Centre (Sunday). OU has never defeated DePauw in SCAC play and its last win against Centre came in 1999.

Rhodes was defeated twice this past weekend and dropped out of the NSCAA Regional rankings for the first time all season. The Lynx were defeated by Southwestern on Friday (2-1) and by Trinity on Sunday (3-2 in double-overtime) to suffer their first SCAC losses of the season. Rhodes scored first against Southwestern when first-year forward Bailey Morgan found the back of the net just 1:03 into the match. However, SU evened the score before the half and scored what turned out to be the game-winner midway through the second. Rhodes fell behind 2-0 to Trinity but rallied with two goals in the 80th minute to force overtime. The Lynx were close to salvaging a point on the weekend when Trinity scored the game-winner with just 18 seconds remaining in the second overtime. Rhodes plays at Methodist (N.C.) on Sunday.

Sewanee scored 19 goals in two games last weekend, defeating Oglethorpe 8-1 on Saturday and Piedmont 11-0 on Sunday. The 19 goals are the most in a two-game span for the Tigers in the SCAC era. Allison Davis and Fritsl Butler both had two goals against OU, and Butler also added an assist. Cat Ariail had a hat-trick against Piedmont and Davis posted her second-consecutive two-goal game. Sewanee out-shot Piedmont 21-1. Sewanee plays host to Centre and DePauw this weekend. Sewanee has won five straight against Centre but is 1-8-0 against DePauw since the Indiana Tigers joined the league in 1998.

Southwestern continued its hot streak this week with two conference wins and has now won six games in a row. The Pirates pulled out the 2-1 win over regionally-ranked Rhodes on Friday. After falling behind one minute in to the game, the Pirates got a goal from first-year Danielle Madison during the 14th minute and then got the game-winner during the 70th minute on a free kick. Southwestern then held Hendrix to just three shots in a 3-1 win to move to 3-0 in the SCAC. This is the best start ever for the SU women's soccer program. The Pirates have one game this week when they travel to Sherman, Texas on Friday to face Austin College.

Trinity scored a pair of SCAC wins over the weekend, defeating Hendrix 6-0 on Friday, then going to double overtime before beating Rhodes 3-2 on Sunday. Six different Tiger players scored goals on Friday against Hendrix, with Bekah Gabay scoring the game-winner. Trinity out-shot Hendrix 55-4 in the game, controlling possession for an overwhelming majority of the time. On Sunday, Trinity took a 2-0 lead over Rhodes with a goal in the 67th minute, then had to hang on for dear life as the visitors made a late push to score a positive result. Rhodes hit a pair of goals just 37 seconds apart in the 82nd minute of play, tying the game and forcing overtime. Then with time winding down in the second overtime, Trinity mounted a last-minute attack that would result in a game-winning goal with just 18 seconds to play. The Tigers will face Austin College on Sunday afternoon in the team's only game this week. Trinity is 6-0-0 against Austin since 1996, including last year's win in the first SCAC matchup of the series.
