**SCAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

Games of September 25 – October 1

**CASEY GRIER OF SOUTHWESTERN UNIVERSITY**, a sophomore forward from Spring, Texas, has been selected the SCAC Women's Soccer Offensive Player-of-the-Week for matches played from Monday, September 25 through Sunday, October 1.

**Grier** scored three goals and was credited with two assists during the week for a total of eight points as the Pirates went 2-1 to improve to 4-5-2 on the season. On Tuesday, **Grier** had a hand in every Southwestern goal as she scored a pair of goals and assisted on the other in the 5-3 road loss at the University of Texas-Dallas. Three days later, **Grier** scored the first goal of the game in the Pirates' 4-2 win against the University of Dallas, and on Sunday, she had an assist in the 8-0 win over Schreiner (Tex.) University. For the season, **Grier** has six goals (tied for second in the SCAC) and 14 points (tied for third in the SCAC).

*Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:*

Senior midfielder/forward Mary Beth Robinson of DePauw had two goals, including the game-winner, in Friday's 4-0 shutout win at Millsaps. She added an assist, her third of the season, in Sunday's 3-2 win at Rhodes. Sophomore forward Erin Menard of Centre scored the first goal against Rhodes giving the Colonels the 1-0 lead in the first half of play. The Colonels went on to win 2-1. Against Millsaps, Menard found the back of the net in the 18th minute of the first half off of an assist from teammate Lizzie Hubbard. She then assisted on Marina Hoe's goal in the 26th minute with a cross from the right flank into the penalty box. For the weekend, Menard accumulated five points on two goals and an assist. Senior forward Kate Semmler of Trinity led the No. 1 Tigers to a 2-0 record this past weekend, defeating Texas Lutheran University and the University of Dallas 2-0 on Friday and Sunday. Semmler scored both of the team's goals on Sunday afternoon, keeping the team unbeaten this season. For the season, Semmler is tied for the team lead with five goals this season, and is second on the team with 11 total points. She has two game-winning goals this season (including Sunday), giving her 10 game-winners for her career at Trinity. Austin, Hendrix, Millsaps and Rhodes did not nominate anyone for the award, and Oglethorpe and Sewanee did not play.

**SCAC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

Games of September 25 – October 1

**JESSICA KOENIG OF TRINITY UNIVERSITY**, a junior defender from Galveston, Texas, has been selected the SCAC Women's Soccer Defensive Player-of-the-Week for matches played from Monday, September 25 through Monday, October 1.

**Koenig** led the Tiger defense to two shutout victories this weekend, pushing the team's win streak to eight games. **Koenig** and the rest of the Tiger back line held Texas Lutheran and Dallas to just one shot each in the two games, giving the team its third consecutive shutout. For the season, the Tigers have allowed just five goals on 59 shots, recording five team shutouts. **Koenig** and the Trinity defense have not allowed a goal in the past 288:56 of play.

*Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:*

First-year goalkeeper Rosie McAuley of Centre had two quality performances against both Rhodes and Millsaps - helping the Colonels to a 2-0 conference start. For the weekend, McAuley had five saves on six shot attempts in 180:00 minutes of play and also secured one shutout. McAuley's performances continue to improve with each match, and she has made numerous "clutch" saves at crucial times for the Colonels. Sophomore back Jacki Ponder of DePauw led the Tigers to a 4-0 shutout at Millsaps and to a 3-2 win at Rhodes. Austin, Hendrix, Millsaps, Rhodes and Southwestern did not nominate anyone for the award, and Oglethorpe and Sewanee did not play.

## AROUND THE SCAC

**Austin** played just once last week – a 1-0 loss to Texas Lutheran on Sunday in Sherman. The loss snapped a three game unbeaten streak by the Kangaroos. Austin kicks off its inaugural SCAC schedule with home matches against Trinity on Friday and Southwestern on Sunday. The Kangaroos last played Trinity in 2003 which resulted in a 5-0 loss to the Tigers. The last two matches against Southwestern have resulted in 1-0 overtime decisions with both squads earning a win apiece. The last time the Pirates visited Sherman – 2004 – Austin defeated Southwestern, needing a single overtime period to pull out the win. Last season, Southwestern turned the tables and earned a double-overtime decision in Georgetown.

**Centre** began conference play this weekend, taking on the Lynx of Rhodes College and the Majors of Millsaps College. The Colonels clinched their first "big win" of the season on Friday with a gutsy 2-1 finish in Memphis. Scoring for the Colonels were sophomore, Erin Menard and freshman, Katie Kerr. Sunday the Colonels traveled to Millsaps defeating the Majors 3-0. Scoring on the outing were: freshman Marina Hoe and sophomores Erin Menard and Morgan Taylor. The Colonels return to conference play this Friday and Sunday at home against Sewanee and Oglethorpe. Centre has not defeated Sewanee since 2001, but has won six straight against Oglethorpe.

**No. 22 DePauw** moved to 2-0 in the SCAC after victories at Millsaps (4-0) and at Rhodes (3-2). Mary Beth Robinson scored a pair of goals, while Emily Petrus and Katy Phillips each added one in Friday's win at Millsaps. The Tigers fell behind 1-0 and then 2-1 in Sunday's match against Rhodes, but DePauw tied the game at 70:15 on an own goal and Kristen McMahon scored the game winner for the Tigers at 72:21. DePauw, the reigning SCAC champion, is 2-0 to start league play for the fifth straight season. The Tigers will try and make it four in a row with home games against Oglethorpe and Sewanee this weekend. DePauw is 8-0-0 against Oglethorpe and 7-1-0 against Sewanee since joining the SCAC in 1998.

**Hendrix** lost two close games this week – both by the score of 1-0. The Warriors first faced Lyon (Ark.) College on Monday. The lone goal came mid-way through the first and proved to be enough to sink the Warriors. On Sunday, the Warriors went to Millsaps to face Spring Hill College. This time it was a first half penalty kick that put away the Warriors. Hendrix will open conference play this weekend by hosting Southwestern on Friday and Trinity on Sunday. Hendrix has never defeated Trinity in the SCAC era (0-14-0) and is 1-10-0 all-time against Southwestern. The lone win against the Pirates came in Conway in 2000 – a 1-0 overtime victory.

**Millsaps** dropped conference games against DePauw (4-0) and Centre (3-0) last weekend, extending the team's loss streak to six games. The Majors have had difficulties finding the net, scoring just three goals in their first 10 games and none in the last five. Millsaps hopes to rebound with a non-conference match against Loyola (La.) on Sunday in Jackson. The Wolfpack have had their own difficulties this year, sporting just a 2-7-0 overall mark heading into this week.

**Oglethorpe**, which was off last week, makes up for the inactivity with three matches this week – a non-conference tilt at Brenau (Ga.) on Tuesday before SCAC road games at DePauw and at Centre. Since DePauw joined the SCAC in 1998, the Petrels have never defeated the Tigers in eight tries. Oglethorpe has also had its difficulties with Centre, losing six straight in the series. Last season's match between the two was a thrilling 3-2 affair that the Colonels pulled out in double-overtime. Dating to last season, Oglethorpe has lost its last seven SCAC matches.

## AROUND THE SCAC

**Rhodes**, after winning its first six matches, has gone 0-1-3 since – including two SCAC home losses last weekend against Centre (2-1) and DePauw (3-2). Caroline Voelkel's goal at 26:12 tied the match with Centre at 1, but the Colonels scored the only goal of the second half to earn the victory. Sunday's loss was even tougher to take for the Lynx. Rhodes led 16th-ranked DePauw on two separate occasions, but an own goal at 70:15 tied the score at 2 before the Tigers netted the eventual game-winner two minutes later. Taking a break from conference play, the going gets no easier for Rhodes as the Lynx tangle with national power Emory (Ga.) University on Sunday in Atlanta.

**Sewanee** was off last week and prepares for a tough SCAC road trip to Centre and DePauw this weekend. Both Centre and DePauw are undefeated in league play this year (2-0-0). Since DePauw joined the league in 1998, Sewanee is 1-7-0 against the Tigers, with that one win coming in 2004 – a 2-1 victory. Sewanee has won four straight against Centre (all of those matches were decided by one goal) and is 8-7-0 in the SCAC era against the Colonels.

**Southwestern** posted a 2-1-0 record in three non-conference games this past week. The Pirates lost to the University of Texas-Dallas, 5-3, on Tuesday and then rebounded on the weekend, defeating the University of Dallas on Friday, 4-2, and Schreiner University, 8-0, on Sunday. In the blanking of Schreiner, Southwestern got a hat trick from junior forward Erin Youngstrom. It was the Pirates' first single-game, three-goal performance since Sept. 16, 2003 when Nicole Morilak pulled off the feat against McMurry.

After moving up two places in the national standings, **No. 2 Trinity** responded with 2-0 shutout victories over Texas Lutheran and University of Dallas. Kate Semmler scored both goals in the final game of the weekend against Dallas, while Michelle Grambeau and Jessica Card hit goals against Texas Lutheran. Grambeau, a first-year player, also had an assist in the TLU game, and is the team's leading scorer with 12 points. She leads the team with six assists, and is tied for second on the team with three goals scored. Up next for the Tigers will be the SCAC road openers against Austin College and Hendrix College. Trinity is 5-0-0 against Austin College since the 1996 season, and the teams will meet for the first time since 2003 - and also the first time in the SCAC. The Tigers are also unbeaten against Hendrix since the 1991 season.
