**SCAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**  
 Games of October 30 – November 5

**CAROLINE VOELKEL OF RHODES COLLEGE**, a junior midfielder from Covington, La., and **JENNIFER WRAY OF TRINITY UNIVERSITY**, a junior midfielder from Abilene, Texas, have been selected the SCAC Women's Soccer Offensive Co-Players-of-the-Week for matches played from Monday, October 30 through Sunday, November 5.

**Wray** scored two goals in the Tigers' 3-1 win over Southwestern, wrapping up the team's regular season schedule. She opened the scoring in the 13th minute of the game, then capped the game's goals with an 86th-minute strike to give the Tigers an important insurance goal. It was the second multi-goal game of the year for **Wray**, who is second on the team in points, goals, and assists. She has eight goals and seven assists, which gives her 23 points on the season. **Wray** is tied for third in the SCAC in points, seventh in the SCAC in goals, and tied for third in the SCAC in assists.

**Voelkel** led the Lynx in wins over Sewanee and Oglethorpe on the road this weekend, completing a five-game SCAC win streak in which she scored at least one goal in four of the five games. **Voelkel** had both goals in the 2-0 shutout of Sewanee and scored her 10th goal of the season in the 7-0 shutout of Oglethorpe. **Voelkel** ends the season with 10 goals and four assists for a team-high 24 points (third in the SCAC).

*Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:*

Sophomore forward Allison Terry of Centre recorded six shots (four of which were on goal) and tallied two goals as the Colonels swept SCAC matches against Austin (1-0) and Hendrix (5-1). For the season, Terry has accumulated seven goals and six assists - earning her 20 points for the season. Sophomore forward Katy Phillips of DePauw had an assist in the 7-0 win over Hendrix and followed with a goal in Sunday's 2-0 blanking of Austin College. Senior midfielder Amanda Paschall of Millsaps, in the final game of her career, scored two late second-half goals in a span of just four minutes in the team's 4-2 loss to Sewanee. Paschall finished the 2006 campaign as the team's leading scorer with five goals and 11 points. Austin, Hendrix, Oglethorpe, Sewanee and Southwestern did not nominate anyone for the award.

**SCAC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

**JACKI PONDER OF DEPAUW UNIVERSITY**, a sophomore back from Carmel, Ind., and **KATY JOYNER OF RHODES COLLEGE**, a sophomore defender from Dallas, Texas, have been selected the SCAC Women's Soccer Defensive Co-Players-of-the-Week for matches played from Monday, October 30 through Monday, November 5.

**Ponder** helped the DePauw defensive effort that recorded two shutouts against Hendrix and Austin. **Ponder** also contributed offensively, scoring a goal in each match, including the game-winner in Sunday's 2-0 victory over the 'Roos.

**Joyner** led the Lynx' defense in a 2-0 shutout of Sewanee and a 7-0 shutout of Oglethorpe in which she also scored a goal. Rhodes' final weekend of the season on the road at Sewanee and Oglethorpe capped off a five-game SCAC win streak in which the Lynx allowed only one goal, earned four shutouts and clinched fourth place in the league standings. **Joyner** was instrumental in Rhodes' season ending nine-game unbeaten streak during which the Lynx have earned eight straight wins, six shutouts and allowed only three goals while scoring 30.

*Other outstanding performances in the SCAC:*

Junior defender Jessica Koenig of Trinity led the Tiger defense to its 16th win of the season, allowing just one goal in the team's final regular season game of the year. Koenig and the defense held Southwestern to just seven shots in the game, as well as holding the Pirates out of the net over the final 75 minutes of action. For the season, Koenig has led the defense to 12 shutouts in 17 games – including seven in nine conference games. Sophomore defender Nicole Wendschlag of Centre played a pivotal role in the Colonel's defensive efforts which helped to secure two wins over the weekend, placing Centre in third place in the SCAC. Wendschlag and the Colonel defense allowed only 10 shots and one goal for the weekend as Centre recorded their eighth shutout of the season with the 1-0 win over Austin on Friday. Austin, Hendrix, Millsaps, Oglethorpe, Sewanee and Southwestern did not nominate anyone for the award.

**AROUND THE SCAC**

**Austin** was shut out twice in its final SCAC weekend, losing 1-0 at Centre on Friday and 2-0 at DePauw on Sunday. The losses dropped the 'Roos to 5-4-0 in conference play and fifth place in their inaugural season in the SCAC. Austin had a hard time getting its offense untracked all weekend, managing just three shots against Centre and one against DePauw. Goalkeeper Allison Wurmbbrand played well in net for the 'Roos, posting five saves against Centre and seven more against DePauw. She finished with the highest save percentage in the league at 84.5% (71 saves and 13 goals allowed).

**Centre** concluded the 2006 campaign with a third-place finish in the SCAC and a 14-5-0 overall record. The 6-3-0 league mark of the Colonels is a complete turnaround from last season when the team went 3-6-0 in SCAC play. Centre was 10th in the NSCAA Great Lakes regionally rankings for two weeks during the season (Weeks 6 and 8). For the second consecutive year, Erin Menard finished the regular season as the league's leading scorer. After scoring 53 points last season, Menard had 35 this year on a league-high 15 goals and five assists.

**DePauw** ended the regular season with two shutouts, a 7-0 blanking of Hendrix and a 2-0 whitewash of Austin. It was the Tigers third straight shutout and ninth of the season – second-best in the SCAC. Lindsay Lund had a hat trick in Friday's victory against Hendrix. The two wins were enough to get DePauw (12-4-0) an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament – the program's sixth postseason appearance. DePauw faces Macalester in the first round in a game that will be played at Wheaton (Ill.) College. The last time DePauw faced Macalester was in an Oct. 31, 2004 game in Greencastle that the Tigers won 2-1 in double-overtime.

**Hendrix** closed out its 2006 season with two conference games on the road. On Friday, the Warriors lost to 17th-ranked DePauw, 7-0. On Sunday against Centre, the Warriors found the net for the first time all weekend on a goal by Kristeen Andreen in the 10th minute – her team-high fifth of the season – which tied the match at 1-1. However, the Colonels scored four unanswered from that point and earned the 5-1 win. Hendrix finished the season 2-13-0 overall and 0-9-0 in conference play – the team's first winless season in the SCAC since 1997.

**Millsaps** lost twice on the weekend to end its season with a 4-14-1 overall mark; 1-8-0 in the SCAC. Millsaps has not won more than one conference match in a single season since 1996, but the four overall wins are the best for the program since 2000. This past weekend the Majors were defeated by Oglethorpe and Sewanee – both by 4-2 margins. Megan Sullivan had both goals against Oglethorpe and Amanda Paschall scored both of the Majors' goals against Sewanee to give her a team-high 12 points (5 goals, 2 assists) for the season.

**Oglethorpe** split its last two games of the 2006 season, defeating Millsaps 4-2, on Friday before losing 7-0 to Rhodes in the season finale. Ryanne Arola had a goal and an assist and Bonnie Morscheiser had her team-best ninth goal in Friday's win over the Majors. Morscheiser finished the 2006 season with a team-best 23 points (tied for fourth in the SCAC). It is the most points in a single-season by an Oglethorpe women's soccer player since Michelle Parks scored 35 points on 13 goals and nine assists in 2000. The Petrels 7-10-1 overall mark is the team's best since 2000.

## AROUND THE SCAC

**Rhodes** had two shutouts to end the 2006 season – posting back-to-back blankings against Sewanee (2-0) and Oglethorpe (7-0). The Lynx ended the season with four straight shutouts. It's the longest streak of shutouts for the program since early 1998 when Rhodes had a string of five consecutive shutouts. The 14 overall wins for the Lynx is the highest total for the program since 1995. Junior midfielder Caroline Voelkel had both goals in Friday's victory against Sewanee. She scored at least one goal in four of Rhodes' last five SCAC matches – all victories for the Lynx.

**Sewanee** split its last two games, taking a 2-0 loss to Rhodes on Friday before rebounding with a 4-2 victory over Millsaps in Sunday's season finale. The win over the Majors was the 10th straight in the series for Sewanee. Maggie Adams and Allison Davis both had a goal and an assist in the Tigers victory on Sunday. Davis finishes the 2006 campaign as the team's leading scorer with seven goals and three assists for 17 points. Sewanee finishes in seventh place in the SCAC standings and an overall mark of 8-6-1, the school's fifth-straight winning season.

**Southwestern** dropped its season finale against top-ranked Trinity University on Saturday by a score of 3-1. Trinity jumped ahead during the 12th minute but the Pirates answered two minutes later with a goal from Kady Smith to tie the match at 1-1. However, Trinity got a pair of goals late in the second half to pull out a 3-1 win. The goal was Smith's fourth of the year as she became the seventh different Southwestern player to score at least four goals this season. Only Trinity had that many players score at least four goals during the 2006 season. Southwestern ends the year with a 7-8-3 record overall, 4-3-2 in conference, and a sixth-place finish in the SCAC.

**No. 1 Trinity** defeated Southwestern 3-1 to close out the regular season last Saturday. Jennifer Wray scored a pair of goals to lead the team to victory – her second multi-goal game of the season. First-year goalkeeper Alexandra Blake allowed just one goal in her first career start, recording four saves and earning the win for Trinity. Trinity won the SCAC with a perfect 9-0-0 record, completing conference play without a loss or a tie for the fifth time in the past seven seasons. The Tigers also earned the SCAC's automatic bid to the post-season, and will travel to Washington to play in a four-team first/second round tournament with Puget Sound, Hardin-Simmons, and Willamette. The Tigers will face Willamette for the fourth time in school history at 11:00 a.m. PST on Saturday, with the record between the teams standing at 1-1-1. Trinity is 10-2-1 against Hardin-Simmons since the 1991 season, while Trinity won its only meeting with Puget Sound – a 2-1 win in the 2002 NCAA Quarterfinals in San Antonio. The Tigers defeated Willamette 3-1 in the NCAA Quarterfinals in 2000, and have also had some classic playoff games against Hardin-Simmons. The Tigers beat the Cowgirls 2-0 in 1999, then Hardin-Simmons downed Trinity 3-2 in 2001. In 2004, Hardin-Simmons went to Trinity and beat previously undefeated Trinity 1-0 to bounce the Tigers from the playoffs, and then Trinity returned the favor in last year's post-season with a 3-2 win in overtime in Abilene. Hardin-Simmons had two losses last year – both of which came at the hands of the Tigers. Earlier this season, the two teams opened the 2006 campaign with a 2-2 tie in San Antonio.
